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INTRODUCTION

Between September of 2018 and October of 2019, the National Bureau of Statistics of Nigeria (NBS) collected the household data for the Nigeria Living Standards Survey (NLSS). NLSS 2018-19 is the first large scale household survey in a decade, focusing on measuring living conditions of the population. The main objectives of the NLSS 2018-19 are: i) to provide critical information for production of a wide range of socio-economic and demographic indicators, including for benchmarking and monitoring of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs); ii) to monitor progress in population's welfare; iii) to provide statistical evidence and measure the impact on households of current and anticipated government policies. In addition, the NLSS 2018-19 could be utilized to improve other non-survey statistical information, e.g. to determine and calibrate the contribution of final consumption expenditures of households to GDP; to update the weights and determine the basket for the national Consumer Price Index (CPI); to improve the methodology and dissemination of micro-economic and welfare statistics in the country.

The NLSS collected a comprehensive and diverse set of socio-economic and demographic data pertaining to the basic needs and conditions under which households live on a day to day basis. The NLSS questionnaire includes the wide-ranging modules, covering demographic indicators, education, health, labor, expenditures on food and non-food goods, non-farm enterprises, household assets and durables, access to safety nets, housing conditions, economic shocks, exposure to crime and farm production indicators.

Several important methodological improvements were implemented in the NLSS 2018-19 compared to the last official survey from 2009-10. First, the NLSS was designed and collected using Computer Assisted Personal Interviewing (CAPI) software on tablet devices. This significantly improved the quality and speed of data collection and processing. Second, by administering a seven-day recall food consumption module instead of a month-long diary (as was done previously), the survey improved the accuracy and cost-effectiveness of collecting food expenditures data. In addition, extra effort was made to measure food quantities where households used non-standard units of measurement, resulting in better quantification of food consumption.

These improvements in questionnaire design and survey implementation techniques have produced overall high-quality data. With the support of the World Bank, the NBS adopted the best practices in the collection and processing of the NLSS household data. As is often the case, making such improvements and achieving high standards in survey implementation often comes at the expense of comparability with past survey rounds. Recognizing the benefits that come with a better survey infrastructure, a deliberate decision was made to use the NLSS 2018-19 as a new and improved baseline for Nigeria's living standards survey system.

This report consists of two parts: it starts by describing the design, implementation process and quality assurance of NLSS 2018-19. This is followed by a set of tables, which provide comprehensive picture of households' living conditions across multiple dimensions: demographic, education, health, employment,

non-farm activities, living amenities and infrastructure etc. The report aims at providing the policy makers and other stakeholders with multidimensional data to understand the factors affecting observed social and economic outcomes in the country

Sample Design and Weights

The sample of enumeration areas (EA) for the NLSS 2018-19 were drawn from the National Integrated Household Surveys (NISH2) master sample that has the state-level domains. Using the NISH2 master sample, 60 EAs were selected in each of the 36 states and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT). A fresh household listing was conducted in each EA, from which 10 households were randomly selected in each EA to be interviewed. The listing was conducted on a quarterly basis (approximately every 3 months) with the 60 EAs in each state being systemically allocated to a quarter to ensure broad coverage of the state in each quarter. Compared to a one-time listing at the beginning of the survey, a quarterly listing helps to minimizing attrition of households due to relocation.

The initial NLSS sample of 22,200 households from the 36 states and FCT, was set to be interviewed over a 12-month period, such that each month, approximately 50 households were to be interviewed. The response rate of households was high, above 93 percent in every state and about 98 percent overall. The final sample comprised of 22,110 households, with much of the difference from initial sample due to security challenges in the state of Borno and subsequent under coverage of the sample in that state.

The sample was designed to provide robust estimates of population's living standards, focusing on household expenditures and poverty headcount ratios with margin of errors on average of 2 percent at national level and below 10 percent at the state levels. Thus, the sample is representative at the state, zonal and national levels. Although the sample is not explicitly stratified by urban and rural areas, it is possible to obtain urban and rural estimates from the NLSS data at the national level.

Household level weights were calculated according to the selection probability of the EAs and the households. After adjusting for nonresponse, the weights were then calibrated to 2019 total population estimates in each state (excluding Borno).

It is important to note that estimates presented in this report exclude the state of Borno. While the NLSS 2018-19 collected information from households in Borno, that sample was not representative of the whole state since only households from accessible areas were interviewed. The security situation in Borno was too unstable at the time of the survey, preventing the interviewers from safely visiting all areas in the state. The sample of EAs for Borno were selected from among the subset of EAs in the frame that were classified as “accessible”. Thus, the Borno sample is considered non-representative and not comparable to other states.

Survey Implementation

The preparation and implementation of the NLSS took place over an extended period. Design of the questionnaire commenced in 2015. As part of the questionnaire design and quality control process, pretest and pilot exercises were conducted. The pretest was conducted in December 2016 in one urban and one rural EA within the FCT. Due to logistical challenges, however, the main survey preparatory activities did not follow immediately after the pretest exercise. A more extensive pilot was conducted in June 2018 in four states – Delta, Kogi, Bauchi and Lagos. The EAs included in the pilot exercise were not part of the original EAs selected for the main survey. Lessons from the pilot exercise helped shape the questionnaire and CAPI application, as well as logistics for the main fieldwork exercise.

Following completion of the pilot, two levels of training were implemented for the main survey. The first level training (training of trainers) was held for trainers/monitors, while the second level training (training of interviewers) occurred for the NBS field personnel who would conduct the survey. At the end of each training, participants were examined, and the best candidates were selected to participate in the main fieldwork. The World Bank technical missions also provided support during the first and second level trainings and throughout the entire survey process.

The main survey data collection commenced in September 2018 and lasted 12 months. There was one data collection team per state comprising three interviewers and a supervisor. Each team traveled to an EA, interviewed all selected households, conducted community interviews, and then moved to the next EA. The order in which the EAs were covered was predetermined and randomized in order to provide more uniform coverage of the state throughout the fieldwork period. Except for scheduled breaks, the teams were in the field throughout the duration of the survey. Breaks in the fieldwork occurred in the holiday period of late December/early January as well as during the general elections held in February 2019.

To ensure that high quality data was collected, multiple levels of monitoring (in-person and remote) were implemented by both NBS and the World Bank throughout the data collection period. During the in-person field monitoring, the NBS monitors observed interviews, conducted spot-checks, addressed any issues that the team had, as well as filtered more substantial issues to headquarters for necessary action. In addition to the in-person monitoring, there was also extensive remote monitoring conducted by the NBS ICT team and the World Bank technical team. The remote monitoring included case-by-case review of each incoming interview as well as global checks for consistency, errors, and outliers. Feedback from the remote monitoring was re-routed to the field teams to be addressed.

The 2018/19 NLSS was conducted using the Survey Solutions Computer Assisted Person Interview (CAPI) platform. The Survey Solutions software was developed and maintained by the Development Economics Data Group (DECDG) at the World Bank. Each interviewer and supervisor were given a tablet which they used to conduct the interviews. Overall, implementation of the survey using Survey Solutions CAPI was highly successful, as it allowed for timely availability of the data from completed interviews and real-time quality checks.

A detailed information on sampling, weights, fieldwork and quality assurance measures is provided in the Basic Information Document published along with NLSS 2018-19 database.

SECTION I: DEMOGRAPHY

Highlights:

1

Nigeria has a large base of young population- more than 54 percent of all males and more than 51 percent of all females are younger than 20 years of age.

2

The share of males and females in total population is roughly equal: 49.2 and 50.8 percent respectively. This pattern is similar across rural- urban areas and across the states, except for Enugu state, where ratio of males over females is only 0.82.

3

The average household size in Nigeria is 5.06 persons per family: in rural areas the size is higher - 5.42 individuals versus 4.50 in urban areas. The highest household size is in Jigawa state- 8.15 persons and the lowest is in Ekiti state where on average the household is composed of 3.50 family members

The total dependency ratio in Nigeria on average is 0.97. The highest dependency ratio is in Jigawa state at 1.40 and the lowest is in Lagos with 0.63 of dependents per 1 working age person.

On average 18.8 percent of households in Nigeria headed by female household member. That share is generally higher in urban areas- 21.4 versus 17.1 percent in rural areas. The lowest share of female headed households is in Niger state with only 1.9 percent and highest is in Ebonyi with 36.0 percent.

The share of females, among those older than 12 years of age, in monogamous marriage is 41.9 percent versus 36.7 percent for males. The share of males and females in polygamous marriage is roughly equal at around 9.9-9.6 percent respectively. The polygamous marriage is more widespread in Jigawa state where 15.1 percent of males and 32.8 percent of females report being in polygamous marriage. The lowest rate of polygamous marriages is in Akwa-Ibom, with less than a percent of males and females entering polygamous marriages.

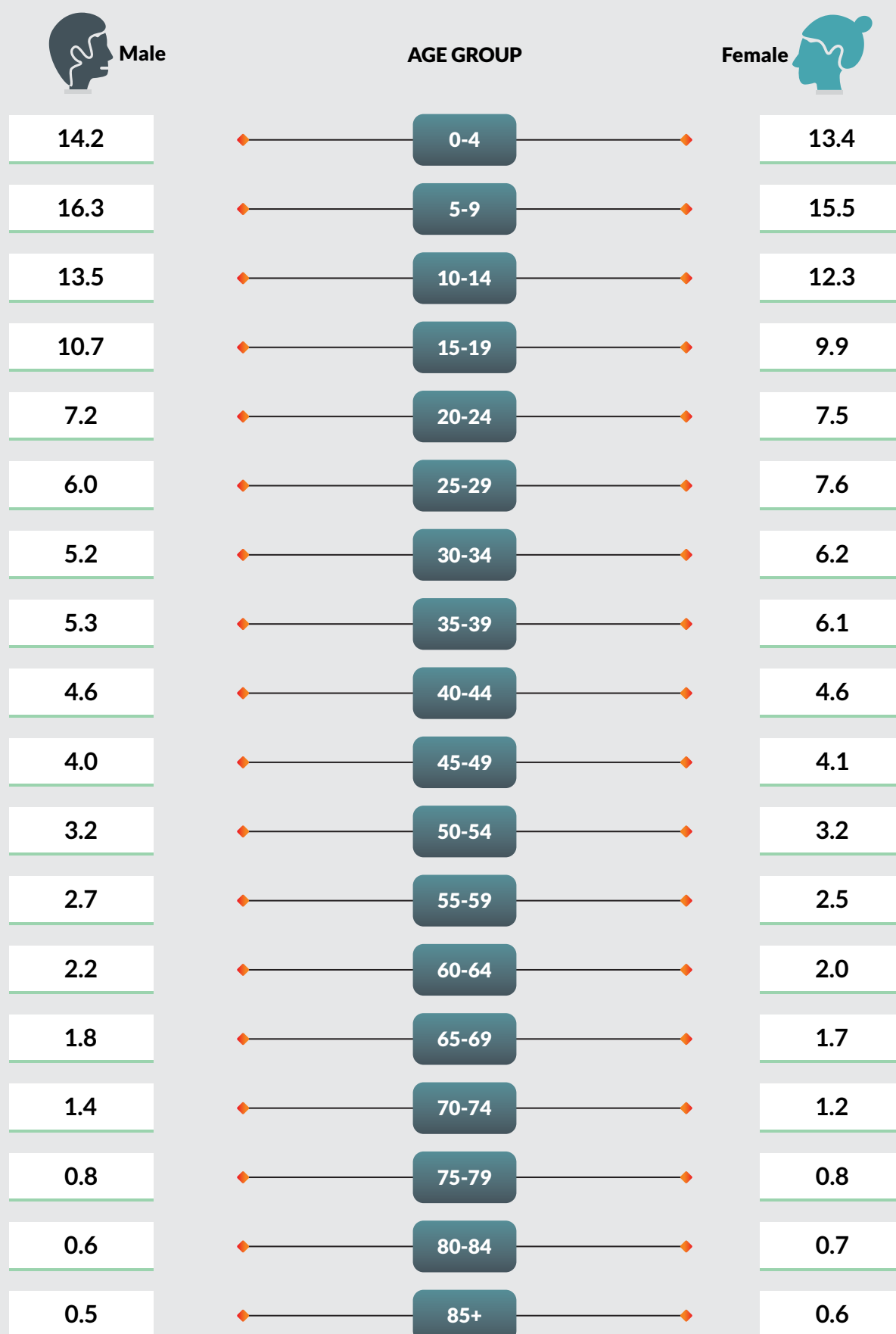

SECTION II: EDUCATION

Highlights:

1

Self-reported literacy rates in reading and writing in English is generally higher among males, 58.5 percent versus 49.0 percent for females. The English literacy is highest in Lagos and lowest in Jigawa state.

2

Among those who are in the age category of 15-24 y.o. the prevalence of English literacy is the higher, reaching 78.3 percent for males than for females - 72.3 percent. The gender gap in English literacy is negligible among group of 10-14 y.o., but the gap widens with the age: by the age of 65 and above the gap between men and women reaches 28.9 percentage points.

On average men have higher years of education, 6.6 years as compared to women, 5.6 years. This pattern is similar across urban and rural areas. Population in Lagos and Rivers states have highest average years of education, while Zamfara has the lowest.

Net attendance rate among children of primary school age in Nigeria is 65.8 percent. The highest rate of net attendance is in FCT Abuja, while the lowest in Yobe state. Net attendance declines with level of schooling: the attendance at the Junior-Secondary school is 38.2 percent and at the Senior-Secondary level is 33.8 percent.

Similar to net attendance the pattern is for the gross enrollment: rates decline with level of schooling: at the Primary level, the enrollment rate is 87.1 percent; at the Junior-Secondary level - 67.6 and at Senior-Secondary Level - 63.0 percent. Pro-male gender gap in enrollment rates stays relatively constant at 3-4 percentage points across all three levels of schooling.

Highlights:



Majority - around 58 percent of children attend public schools, and 32 percent attend private educational institutions. Close to 85 percent of children in state of Niger rely on public schools, while in state of Abia only 31 percent go to Government schools.



For about 39.3 percent of children in Nigeria, it takes up to 30 minutes to reach the school. In state of Sokoto, 72.4 percent of students live within 15-minute proximity to school. While in Ebonyi state, third of school children have to travel up to 45 minutes to reach the school.



In Nigeria, about 14.3 percent of population above 5 years of age have never attended school. That number is higher in rural areas – 18.9 percent as compared to urban areas- 6.3 percent. The higher the age the higher the number of people with no schooling: among age group of 65 and above, 26.7 percent of men and 62.4 percent of women never went to school. The lowest rate is among the youth of 15-24 y.o., where 6.1 percent of males and 16.9 percent of females have not attended school.



Among the primary reasons of never attending the school, the reluctance and lack of interest on the parent's part dominate the list of answers, as reported by 43.0 and 56.8 percent of male and female respondents respectively.



In Nigeria, 30 and 22 percent of males and females above 25 years of age report having Senior-Secondary level of education as highest educational qualification. Only 16 percent of males and 8 percent of females report having tertiary level of education. In Lagos 31.6 percent of males and 23.9 percent of females have tertiary education, while in Zamfara only 3.9 percent of men and less than a percent of women obtained tertiary degree.

SECTION III: HEALTH

Highlights:

1

Suffering from self-reported health issues is reported by 34.9 percent of men and 37.4 percent of women. In rural areas the incidence of health problems is slightly higher, 36.8 versus 31.3 percent for men and 39.7 vs 33.3 percent for women in rural versus urban areas respectively. Across age groups, the self-reported incidence is U shaped: at around 40 percent for infants (0-4 y.o.); then lowest among the age category of 10-14 y.o - 29.2 for boys and 27.1 for girls and increasing again for elderly, aged 65 years and older- 58 percent for men and 66.6 percent for women.

Malaria is a dominant reason for health problems in Nigeria. More than half- 51.7 percent of who reported health issues mention Malaria as top health concern. In Zamfara 65.4 percent of those who reported sickness suffer from Malaria, while in Bauchi only 30.8 percent reported that issue.

Major share of ill people visit chemist in search of medical treatment, 36.6 percent of men and 35.5 percent of women. The hospitals are visited by 18.7 and 19.7 percent of males and females respectively. In Kwara state 49.7 percent of males and 46.5 percent of females visit the hospitals for medical treatment-the highest rates among all states in Nigeria.

On average it takes about 2 hours and 9 minutes to reach and receive consultations in the hospitals and only 50 minutes in pharmacy or at local chemist.

While 80 percent who decided not to seek medical treatment for health problems report having minor illness, around 14 percent mention that cost of receiving the medical treatment is too expensive, which precluded them from seeking medical help.

About 4.9 percent of men and 6.6 percent of women reported being admitted to hospital. The share of hospitalization is highest in Delta state, where 26.6 percent of males and 24.9 percent of females were hospitalized. The lowest rate is in Zamfara with less than 1 percent of population admitted to the hospital in the last 12 months.

About half of population: 49.9 and 52.4 percent of males and females use insecticide treated mosquito bed-net. In Jigawa state 97.6 of men and 98.5 percent of females report sleeping under bed-net- the highest incidence of net use. While in Lagos 12.4 and 14.4 percent of males and females respectively report using the mosquito net.

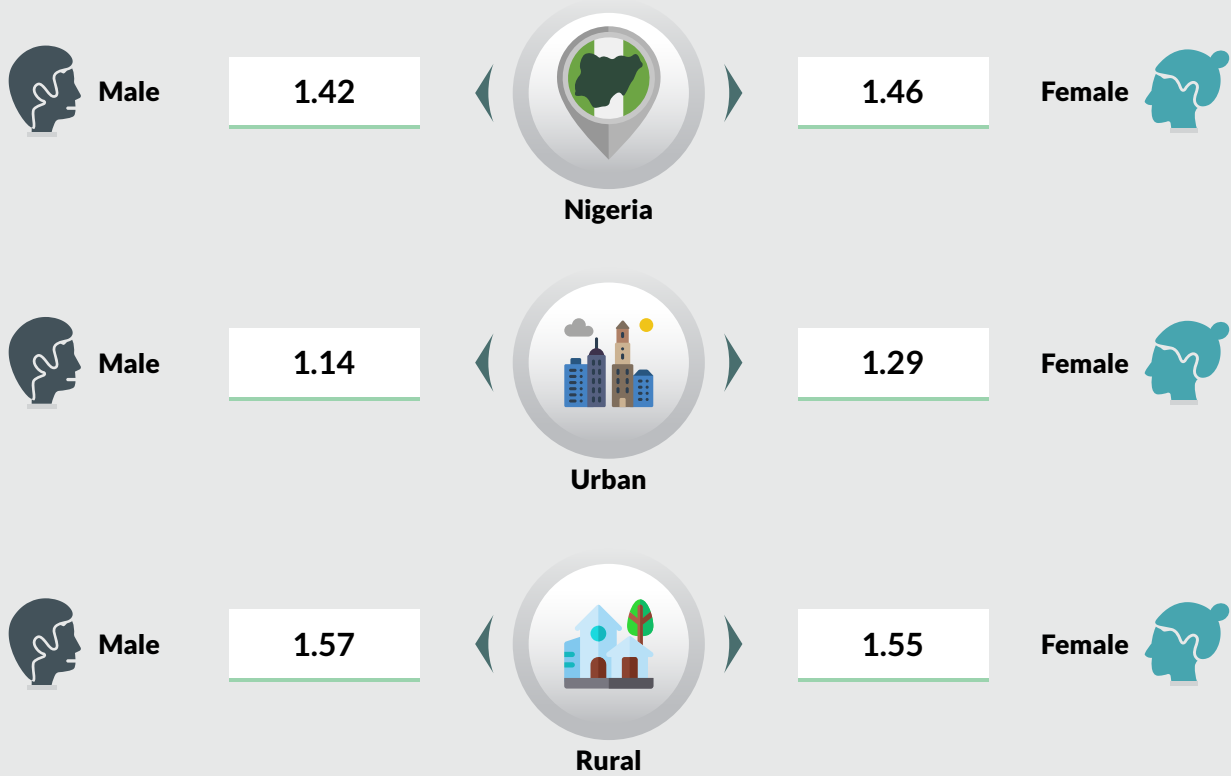

SECTION IV: EMPLOYMENT AND REMITTANCES

Highlights:

1

More than 52 percent of total population in Nigeria is of working age, i.e. between 15 and 64 years of age. That share is highest in Lagos- 62.2 percent and lowest in Jigawa-44.1 percent.

2

Among adults (age 15 years and above), 15.0 and 22.9 percent of men and women work in own non-farm enterprise. Around 29.5 percent of males and 19.6 percent of females participate in farming activity. Many individuals, 15.2 percent of men and 10.7 percent of women are simultaneously involved in several activities- combination of wage, farm and non-farm work. Large share of adults, 25.3 and 38.7 percent of males and females do not participate in any income earning activities. In Sokoto state 42.6 percent of adult men do not report working- the highest rate in a country. While in Kebbi state only 6.6 percent of adult men do not work- the lowest share in the country.

3

On average, those who report working, spend on average 41.5 hours at work (in the last 7-day period). Men report higher number of hours working, 44.5 versus 38.0 for women. Working population in the state of Anambra report highest working hours- 54.9 versus 25.6 in the state of Bauchi.

4

Among those who do not work, 48.3 and 34.5 percent of male and females report attending school as the main reason for not looking for job. Large share, 32.1 and 47.2 of men and women mention involvement in household duties. Only 3.3 percent report non availability of jobs in the area as the main reason.

5

Around 11.6 percent of males and 5.3 percent of females are involved in wage employment. Among adults in Lagos the share of wage employed is the highest, 30.3 for men and 16.8 percent for women.

6

Among those who have wage employment, most women-38.9 percent employed in education sector, and 12.9 percent of men are in public administration. Highest share of wage employed men with public administration job is in Gombe state-32.6 percent.

Highlights:

1

Dominant share of wage employed workers are employed by private sector-65.1 and 58.8 percent of men and women respectively report being employed by private entities. About 9.2 percent of men and 8.3 percent of wage-employed individuals said that their employer is the Federal Government. That share is the highest in FCT Abuja, where 35.9 and 31.8 percent of males and females respectively have federal government jobs.

4

Among children of 5-14 years of age, 21.4 and 25.1 percent of boys and girls do not study nor work. The share of school age children not working nor studying is highest in Sokoto, where 53.7 of boys and 72.8 percent of girls are out of school and work. The lowest share is in Lagos with less than one percent of children without work or school.

5

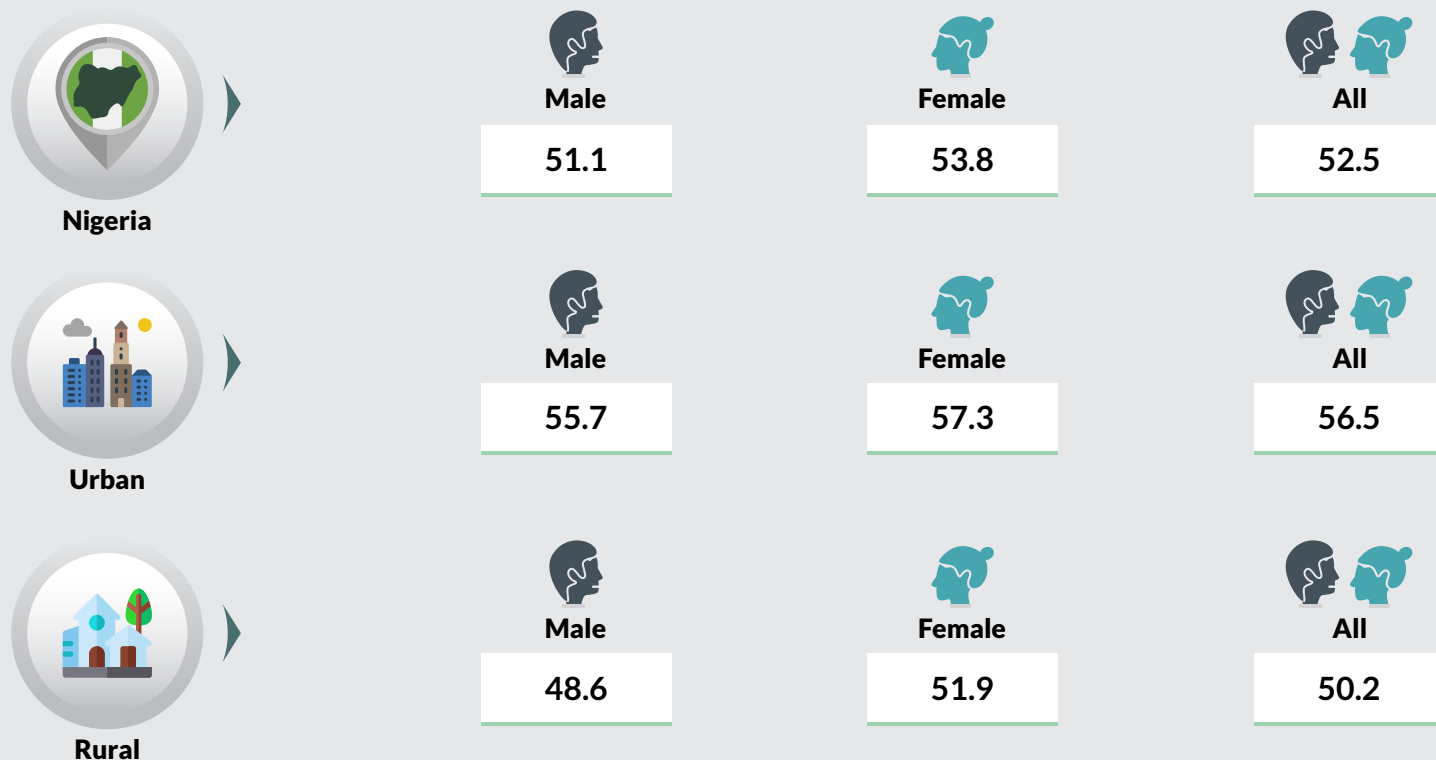
Large share of population in Nigeria is involved in collecting water, wood and other products. More than 37.3 percent of males and 45.5 percent of females say that they are involved in water collection on regular basis. That share is highest in Cross-Rivers state, where 59.9 percent of males and 67.9 percent of females collect water. Wood and other products of nature are regularly being collected by more than 21 percent of population. That share is larger in rural areas, where close to 29 percent of population spend time to gather wood and natural products.

6

Large share of households – 54.0 percent report receiving remittances: 52.7 percent receive remittance from someone in Nigeria and 5.7 percent from abroad. The state of Kebbi has the largest share of household-remittance-recipients – 81.4 percent and state of Sokoto has the lowest number, only 5.6 percent receive any remittance. The average value of domestic remittance is 62,492 Naira and of international remittance is 84,741 Naira. More than 80 percent of households who receive remittance report using the transfers for consumption purposes.

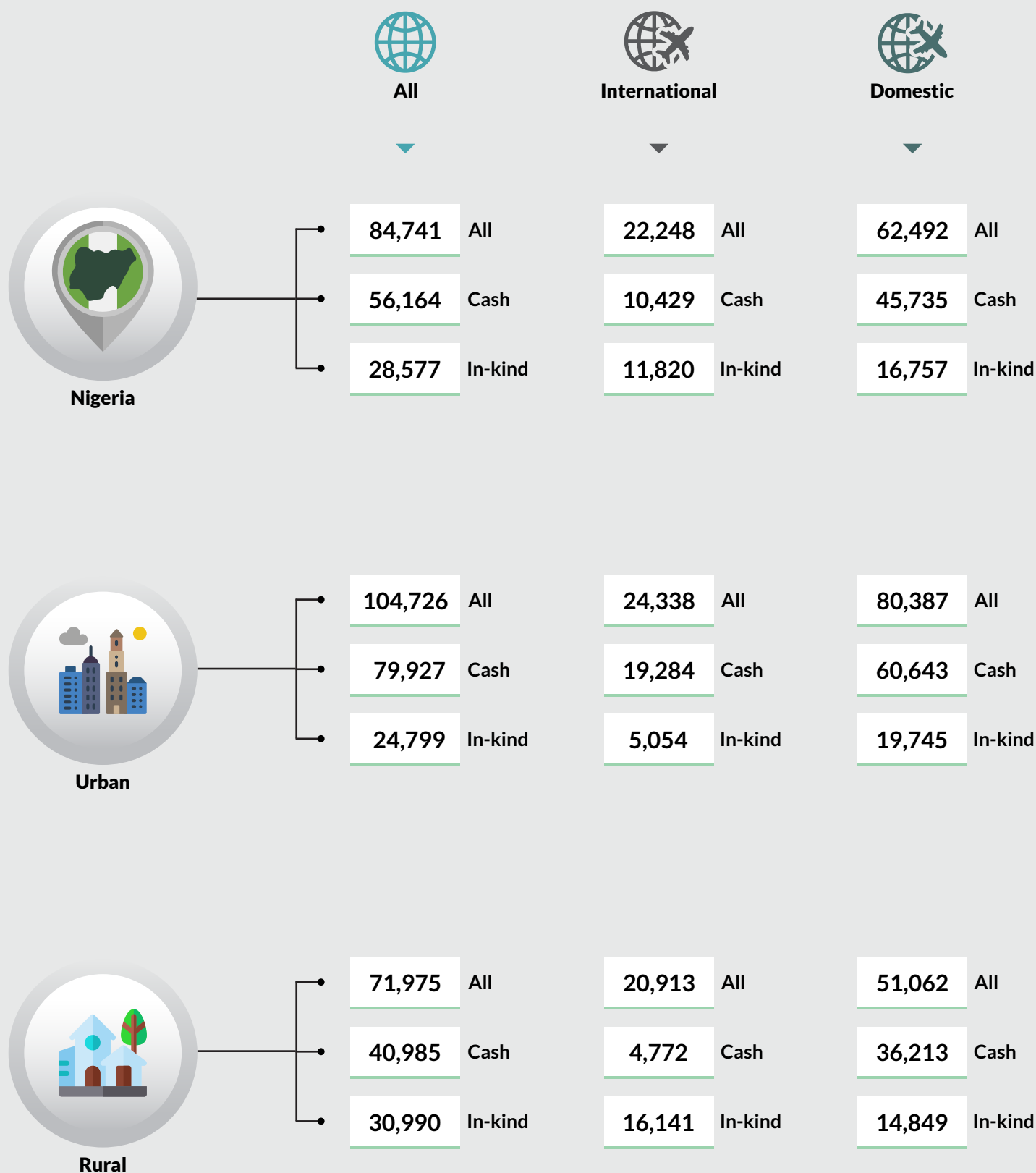

MEDIUM OF CASH REMITTANCES (IN PERCENT OF INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING REMITTANCES)



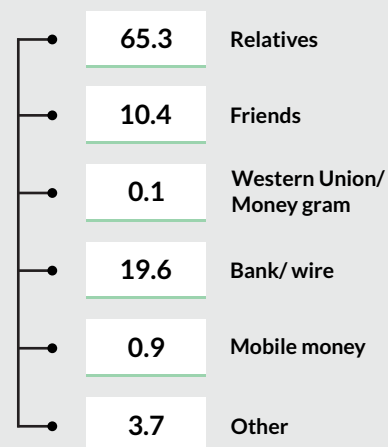
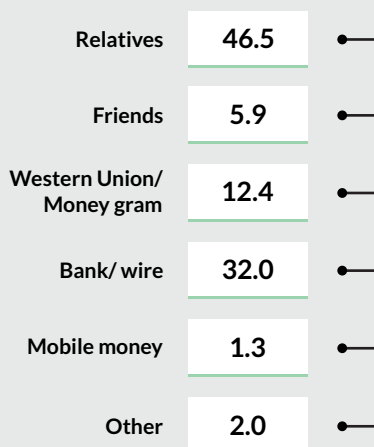
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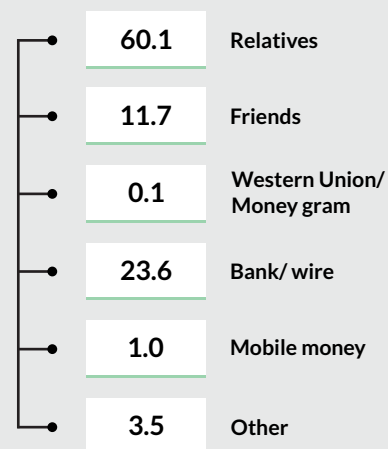
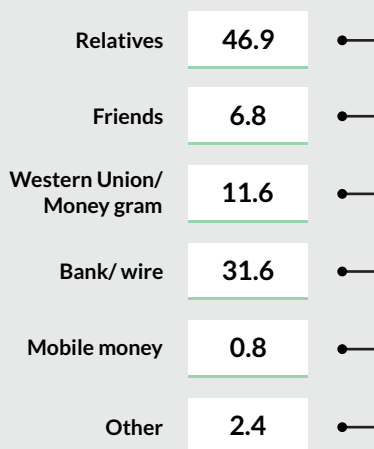

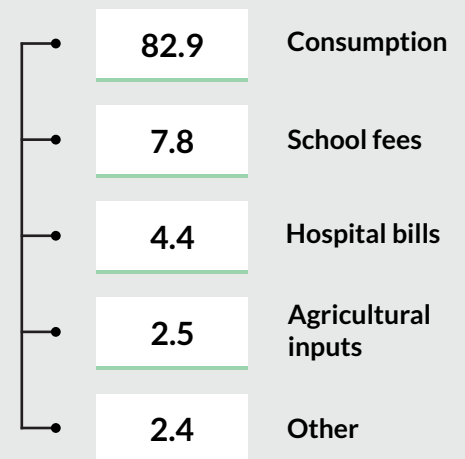
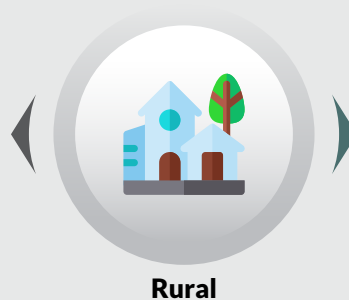
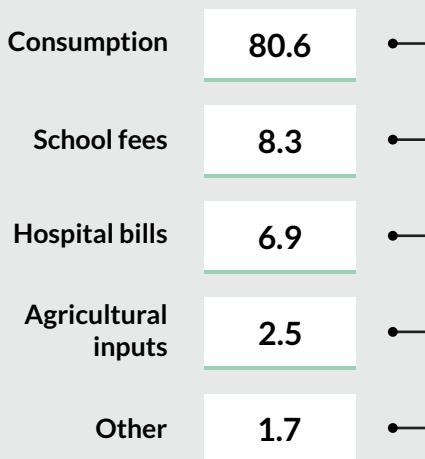
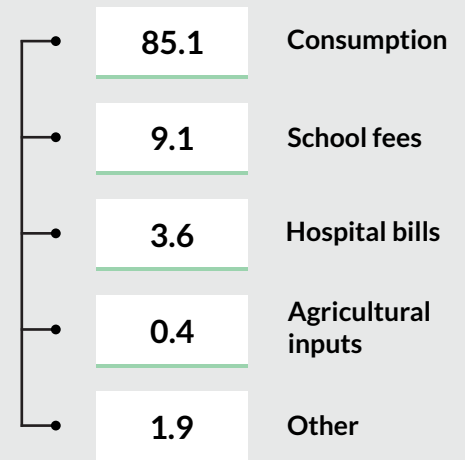
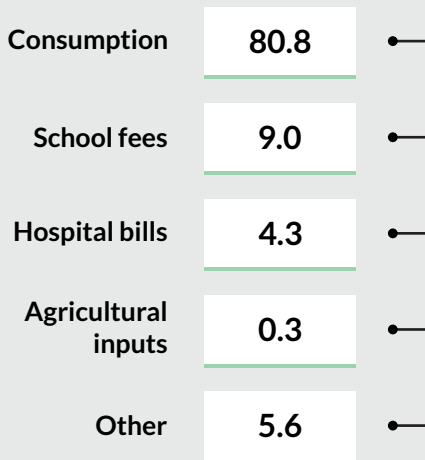
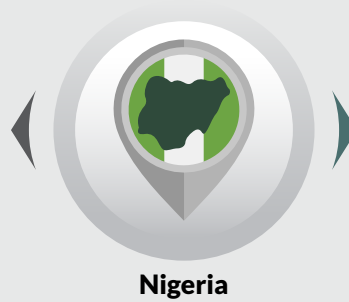
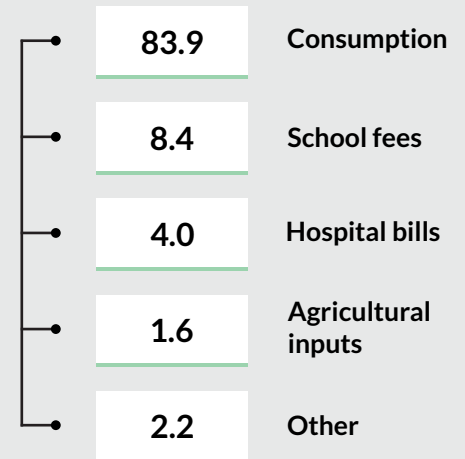
MAIN PURPOSES OF CASH REMITTANCES (IN PERCENT OF INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING REMITTANCES)

SECTION V: NON-FARM ENTERPRISE

Highlights:

1

About 62 percent of households in Nigeria are engaged in non-farm activities. Just a small share of those non-farm enterprises (NFE) is registered- 9.4 percent. On average the NFEs employ 1.1 persons from own-household and 0.4 non-household member. Katsina state has the highest share – 87.3 percent of households involved in NFE activities, while in Sokoto about third of households engaged in non-farm activities.

2

About half- 47.5 percent of those NFEs are in the retail trade business, followed by provision of personal services-9.7 percent and provision of food services – 8.5 percent.

3

The dominant share of NFEs- 72.8 percent started out the business using household savings, and only about 10 percent relied on formal source of startup capital.

4

More than 85 percent of the NFEs directly produce and provide services to the final consumers and the rest rely on other business and supply chains to deliver the goods and services to the markets.

5

Only 10 percent of NFEs report facing no constraints in opening the business. However, 21.5 percent of NFE households say that access to electricity is a primary hurdle. This is followed by 19.1 percent pointing to problems with access to credit, i.e. inability to borrow the money to start a business. Problems with access to electricity is most acute in Adamawa, where 58.1 percent of NFEs indicate this as a constraint.

Similar pattern emerges, when NFEs asked about problems with developing and growing a business. Close to 20 percent report access to electricity as a constraint and 15.8 percent point to inability to borrow of money. Large share- 19.4 percent also say that low demand on the consumer side impedes growth of the business.

SECTION VI: HOUSING AND LIVING CONDITIONS

Highlights:

1

More than 42 percent of households in Nigeria reside in compound houses, 21.4 percent live in separate houses and 16.3 percent in apartments. Survey indicates that both in rural and urban areas the major share of households resides in compound housing, 35.3 and 47.5 percent in urban and rural areas respectively.

2

More than 54 percent of households own the dwelling in which they reside, while 25.8 percent rent the housing. The share of renters is 49.2 percent in urban areas, whereas in rural areas only 10.4 percent rent the dwelling. The largest share of households who rent is in Lagos – 68.3 percent and lowest is in Zamfara and Jigawa- 1.4 percent.

3

Most households - 71.4 percent who own the dwelling do not have any documents/certificate of occupancy; 13.2 percent have title deed and only 8.1 percent have certificate. The highest prevalence of ownership certificate is in Lagos – 22.9 percent.

4

About 60.7 percent of households reside in a housing with cement or concrete walls, that share is higher in urban areas, 86.4 percent and 43.8 percent in rural areas. However, 31.5 of households live in houses made of mud walls. In Zamfara state more than 81 percent dwell in houses with mud walls.

5

Roofing in 57.8 percent of households is made of corrugated iron sheets, followed by zinc sheet for 18.3 percent of households. Roofing made of thatch is observed in 13 percent of households among rural residents.

6

In 70.3 percent of household the flooring material is made of cement or concrete. However, mud and straw/sand flooring reported among 14.1 and 5.6 percent of households respectively.

7

Two room dwellings are occupied by 31.9 percent of households; in one-roomed housing reside close to 24.5 percent of households.

8

Almost all households cook at home. More than 51 percent use 3-stone/open fire cookstove for cooking food. LPG/ gas fueled cookstoves are being used by 17.1 percent of households; in urban areas that number is 35.5 percent while in rural areas only 5.1 percent utilize gas-based cookstoves.

Highlights:

9

Regardless of the type of cookstove used by household, 34.8 percent of households use the cookstove in outdoors; 30.3 percent use it inside the dwelling, but not in sleeping areas and 22.0 percent locate the cookstove in a separate dwelling.

10

More than 63 percent of households have access to electricity from any source. Access varies by geographic location: in Taraba state only 19.2 percent of household report having electricity, while in Lagos 98.7 of household have electricity. Among those who indicated having electricity 82.2 percent reported national grid as a main source and about 16 percent have generator powered electricity.

11

However, those who connected to national grid, report having electricity only for 6.8 hours per day; those who use generator use it for 4.1 hours per day. In addition, those who have grid electricity say that they have experienced 10 blackouts in the past 7 days with average duration of 12 hours.

12

Almost a third – 32.1 percent of households use borehole/tube well as the primary source of drinking water (in the rainy season). Access to piped and public standpipe water is 3.3 and 4.2 percent respectively. More than 17 percent of households collect rainwater and 5.8 percent use water from the surface of the water body (e.g. river, stream etc.).

13

Most households in Nigeria need to fetch water and on average it takes 20.6 minutes during dry season and 18.7 minutes in rainy season to walk to and back from the water source.

14

About 7.2 percent of households treat water in some way. More than 1 percent boil water, 2.3 percent add bleach or chlorine to disinfect and 2.6 percent let the water settle.

15

Quarter of all households, 25.1 percent do not have any toilet facility; 14.9 percent use open pit; 21.1 percent have pit latrine with slab. The flushed toilet is available for 24.6 percent nationally and 44.4 percent in urban areas. In Lagos 64.7 percent of households have flushed toilet- the highest prevalence in the country.

16

Among the set of standard household appliances, the most prevalent item is regular mobile phone- 75.8 percent of households have it, while only 28.9 percent have a smart-phone. TV set is available across 48.0 percent of households; that number is higher – 74.7 percent in urban areas, while in rural only 30.5 have access to TV. Across the country 8.5 percent have auto, in urban areas that number is 13.9 percent versus 4.9 in rural areas. Motorbikes are owned by 24.9 percent of households. One in every five households own fridge; prevalence of fridge possession is highest at 20.4 percent in Edo state, while in Yobe state only 0.5 percent have fridges.

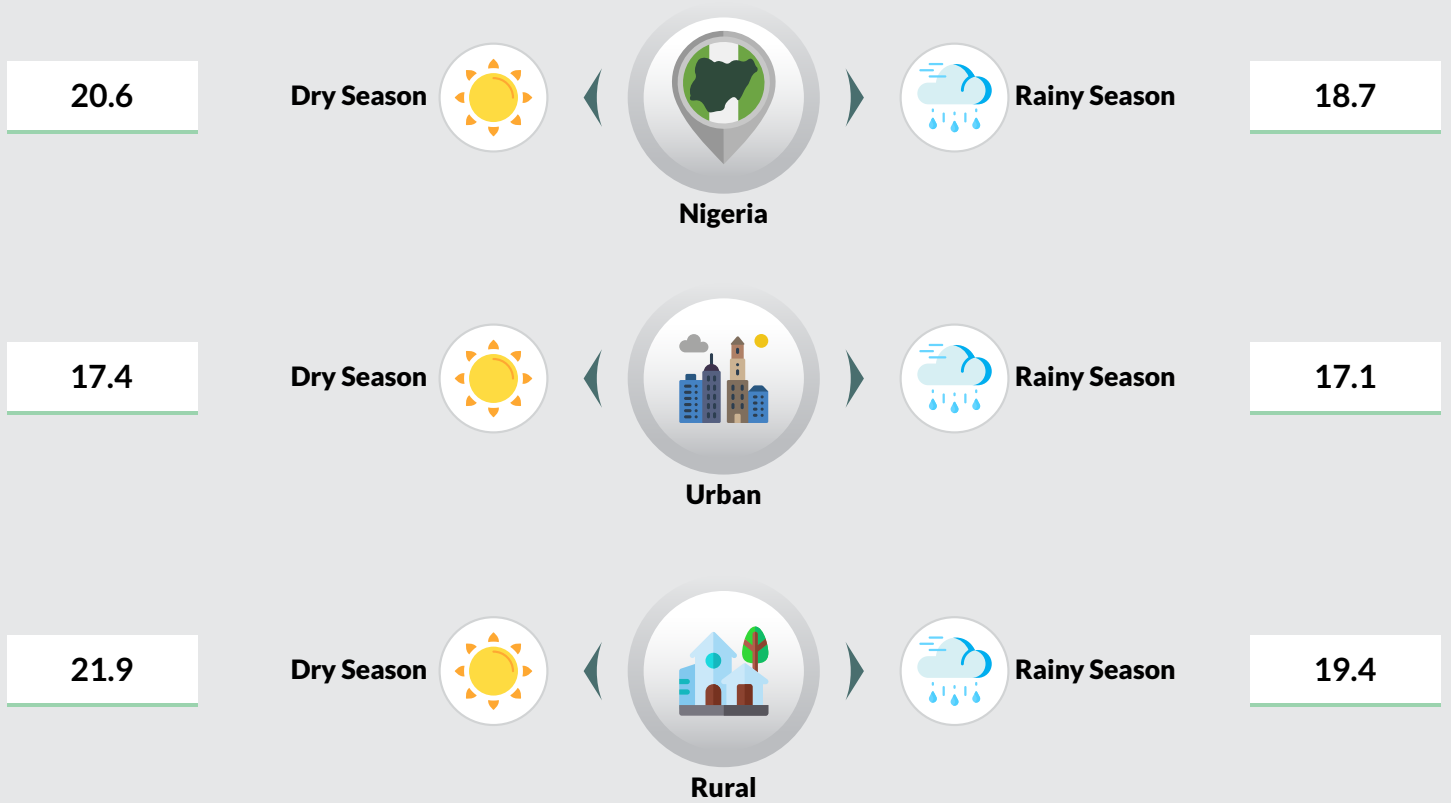

SECTION VII: CONSUMPTION FREQUENCY OF FOOD CATEGORIES AND HOUSEHOLD SHOCKS

Highlights:

1

On average the households in Nigeria consume oils and fats 6 days per week; vegetables consumed for 5.7 days; grains and flours are consumed for 5.3 days; but meat and fish are consumed only during 2.6 days per week. Households in Delta state have meat and fish for 4.9 days, while in Kano that category is consumed on average during 0.6 days per week.

2

Almost half of all households- 46.8 percent share their meals with someone who is not considered a household member. Meals are shared more in rural areas, where 50.6 percent of households share meals. During the week on average the meals are shared for 2.3 days mostly with someone who is of working age. In Bauchi state, 93.2 percent of households report sharing the meals with non-members of household.

3

Many households in Nigeria were affected by negative life events in the last three years preceding survey. More than 37 percent of households report being exposed to increase in prices of major food products; 20.1 percent are affected by poor rains or flooding causing harvest failures; 13.3 percent experienced loss or disability of working household member.

4

When faced with shocks and negative events, 46.5 percent say they do not have specific coping strategy; but 11.7 percent of exposed households report reducing food consumption in order to manage the impact of shocks; 9.2 percent were able to receive assistance from family and friends and 6.6 percent mobilized and engaged in additional income generating activity.
