Also, the current socio-economic challenges being faced by the country has made it imperative for quantitative socio-economic data to be generated on regular basis.

As the coordinator of the National Statistical System (NSS) and the authoritative source of all official statistics in Nigeria, the National Bureau of Statistics; herein referred as the Bureau, ensures collaborations across all tiers of governments and civil societies organisations in statistical delivery on all facets of human endeavours towards meeting the data demands of policymakers and users both within and outside the country.

This publication is in the league of the Bureau's specific mandate of collecting, collating, processing, analysing and disseminating statistical information on all facets of the Nigerian economy as well as coordinating the production of relevant official statistics at all levels of governance in Nigeria.

The Social Statistics Report 2020 is a compilation of data on the contemporary social situations in Nigeria. The report presents a variety of social and economic statistics that measure the quality of life. The data for this publication was mainly sourced by administrative means from relevant Federal Government Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs).

The Social Statistics Report is an annual publication with 3 years information across several indicators. The information presented in this report spans from 2017 to 2019, which serves as an estimate for measuring the social and economic conditions of the citizenry of Nigeria. This report has been divided into thirteen chapters and each chapter discussed a sector of the economy; the sectors covered in the report

include Anti-Corruption, Education, Health, Humanitarian Service, Security, Justice, Energy, Tourism, Transportation and Water Resources.

I wish to acknowledge the support of the Planning, Research and Statistics Departments of the relevant Federal MDAs who supplied data for the compilation of this report. I seek for further support from these agencies to assist the Bureau in data gathering for future publications.

This report will go a long way in meeting the needs of policymakers, researchers, students, social advocates and other relevant stakeholders to formulate policies and strategies in Nigeria. It is, therefore, my pleasure to present this edition of Social Statistics Report 2020 to all users.

CHAPTER ONE

ANTI-CORRUPTION


Corruption is an adverse global phenomenon. It has persistently become a major challenge especially in developing economies like Nigeria. It destabilizes society, endangers the rule of law, undermines the institutions and values of democracy, and threatens sustainable economic development. Unfortunately, the poor are most affected because they depend largely on public resources and social security.

The negative impact of corruption necessitated the emergence of anti-corruption campaigns. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Agenda 2030 emphasises the importance of transparency, accountability and anti-corruption for sustainable development. It also states that there is a direct link between corruption, peace, justice and inclusive society. This chapter deals with corruption-related data in Nigeria, reported by Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC) and Economic Financial Crimes Commissions (EFCC).

1.1 Economic and Financial Crime

Figure 1: shows the total value of money recovered through internal and external sources from 2017 to 2019. Data from the EFCC indicates that in 2017, the total money recovered in Naira was ₦39.12billion which increased to ₦133.45 billion in 2018 and thereafter, decreased to ₦26.43billion in 2019. Moreover, in 2017 the amount recovered in Dollar was \$10.02million, which declined in 2018 and 2019 with \$7.98 million and \$7.32 million respectively. Similarly, the value of money retrieved in Euro in 2017 was €67,514.90, it increased in 2018 to €298,055, and declined in 2019 to €59,545. (See Table 1.3, 1.4, 1.5).

1.1.1 Economic Crime Cases in Nigeria

The total number of persons arrested for economic crime cases was the same in 2017 and 2018 with 754 (702 males and 52 females in 2017, 682 males and 72 females in 2018). In 2019, it increased to 1,022 with 943 males and 79 females.

In the period under review, the total number of persons convicted shows an upward increase from 102 (male 101 and female 1), to 105 (male 104 and female 1) and 158 (male 145 and female 13) in 2017, 2018 and 2019 respectively.


The total number of economic crime cases reported in 2017, 2018 and 2019 were 819, 641, and 1,338 respectively. Moreover, the number of cases under investigation in 2017 was 422, it decreased in 2018 to 381, and rose to 903 in 2019. On the other

hand, the cases charged to court in 2017, 2018 and 2019 were 53, 41 and 75 respectively. (See Table 1.7, 1.8 & 1.9).

1.1.2 Independent Corrupt Practices

The data from ICPC indicates that reported cases of corruption has steadily increased under the period of review from 1,582 in 2017 to 1,650 in 2018 and further increased to 1,933 in 2019.

CHAPTER TWO

EDUCATION


Education plays an indispensable role in the growth and development of a nation. It is a key factor in building human capacity which is paramount in achieving the economic growth and development of any country.

Education is bedrock to the advancement of any nation. This education data will help to foster planning at all levels and simultaneously have a positive impact on other sectors. The data on Education is structured into Basic Education (Early Childhood Care Development and Education (ECCDE), Primary and Junior Secondary), Senior Secondary and Tertiary Institutions.

2.1 Basic Education


Nationally, enrolment in Private Basic Education at the ECCDE level in 2018 was 3,496,486 while Primary and JSS recorded 5,504,632 and 1,652,860 respectively. In Public Basic Education, the ECCDE level recorded 3,662,776, while primary recorded 22,384,775 and JSS has 5,189,093 enrolments.

Figure 3: 2018 Total Enrolment in Private and Public Schools by Level




The qualifications of persons teaching in the Basic Education reported thus; in 2018, teachers with NCE certificate were the highest in public primary schools in Nigeria with 363,269, while PhD was the least with 58. In public junior secondary schools, teachers with B.Ed/BA. Ed/B.Sc. Ed certificates were the highest with 86,330, followed by teachers with NCE certificate with 85,552, while the least was PhD with 123.

In 2018, the number of teachers in ECCDE with NCE qualification in private schools was 43,387, those with B. Ed/BA. Ed/BSc. Ed were 8,055 and PhD were 15. Private primary schools have 127,676 NCE holders, 43,472 B. Ed/BA. Ed/BSc. Ed holders, PGDE and PhD with 8,320 and 128 respectively. Private junior secondary schools had 46,719 B. Ed/BA.Ed/BSc.Ed; 10,103 PGDE and 160 PhD holders.


Figure 5: Highest Teaching Qualification in Private Schools by Level (2018)



2.2 Nomadic Education


There was a continuous increase in the number of nomadic primary schools in the period under review. The number recorded in 2017 was 3,582, it increased to 3,840 and 4,026 in 2018 and 2019 respectively.

There was a steady increase in the total number of nomadic primary school pupils in 2017, 2018 and 2019 with 564,911, 700,557 and 1,140,940 respectively.


Figure 7: Number of Nomadic Primary School Pupils by Year



In 2017, the number of male teachers in Nomadic primary school was 6,546, it rose to 9,486 in 2018 and 11,359 in 2019, while the number for female teachers stood at 4,748 in 2017, which increased to 5,182 in 2018 and 5,771 in 2019. (See Table 2.16).

Moreover, the permanent structures for nomadic schools in 2017 were 4,184, this increased to 4,189 and 4,271 in 2018 and 2019 respectively. The semi-permanent structures decreased from 1,085 in 2017 to 1,084 in 2018 and rose to 1,103 in 2019, while Under Tree Shade recorded 1,332, 1,392 and 1,342 in 2017, 2018 and 2019 respectively.

2.3 Teacher Registration Council

There was a consistent increase in the number of registered teachers (Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria) from 1,289,480 in 2017 to 1,310,988 in 2018 and 1,383,972 in 2019.


Figure 9: Number of Registered Member with Teacher Registration Council by Year



2.4 Business and Technical Examination

The total number of technical schools in 2017 was 263, it reduced to 256 in 2018 and increased to 290 in 2019.

In 2017, enrolment in NABTEB Nov/Dec trade examinations was 16,339, this decreased to 14,045 in 2018 and 13,901 in 2019.





Figure 11: Enrolment for Nov/Dec NBC/NTC and ANBC/ANTC Examinations by Year

May/June trade examination enrolment in 2017 was 32,334, which decreased to 31,441 in 2018 and 31,395 in 2019.


Figure 12: Total Enrolment for May/June NBC/NTC Examinations by Year

2.6 Enrolment into Public and Private Universities

Undergraduate enrolment into Federal Universities in 2017/2018 academic section was 1,137,673 with 654,396 male and 483,277 female. State Universities recorded 479,853 comprising 260,534 male and 219,319 female while Private Universities recorded 93,608 with 45,487 male and 48,121 female. Number of undergraduate enrolments for Federal Universities, 2018/2019 academic year was 1,146,091 (662,748 male and 483,343 female), State Universities recorded 541,286 (293,170 male and 248,116 female) while Private Universities recorded 111,581 (54,691 male and 56,890 female).

Figure 14: Undergraduate Enrolment 2017/2018 Academic Session





Figure 15: Undergraduate Enrolment 2018/2019 Academic Session




2.7 Joint Admission and Matriculation

2.7.1 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) Application

In 2017, the total number of candidates that applied through UTME was 1,722,236, it decreased to 1,653,127 in 2018 and increased to 1,886,488 in 2019.


Figure 16: Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) Application by Year



2.7.2 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) Admission

The number of male candidates that were admitted through UTME in 2017 was 235,130 and female was 193,119. In 2018, the number increased to 319,538 for males and 263,055 for females while in 2019, Male increased to 328,106 and females to 280,753.

CHAPTER THREE

HEALTH

The Nigerian health sector is responsible for the coordination of healthcare provisions. Healthcare provision is also a joint responsibility of government at the national and sub-national levels as well as private individuals who play vital roles in healthcare delivery.

3.1 Companies Registration with National Agency for Food and Drug Administration and Control (NAFDAC)

In 2017, the number of companies that applied for registration with NAFDAC was 6,999, the application increased to 9,111 in 2018 but reduced to 9,068 in 2019. Products presented for approval to NAFDAC in 2017 were 11,406; this reduced to 10,587 in 2018 and increased to 11,018 in 2019. The numbers of new products granted approval by NAFDAC were 11,240 in 2017; it declined to 10,394 in 2018 and increased to 10,875 in 2019 while the number of new products rejected by NAFDAC were 166 in 2017, 193 in 2018 and dropped to 129 in 2019.



3.2 Doctors and Dentists in Nigeria


In 2019, Lagos state had the highest number of doctors with 2,561 followed by FCT with 2,523. Taraba had the lowest number of medical doctors with 86.

Lagos State ranked the highest with 261 dentists, followed by FCT with 121. The total number of female dentists (555) was lower than the total number of males dentist (810).

3.3 Infant Immunization

The number of infants immunized with Oral Poliovirus Vaccines (OPV 3) was 6,650,963 in 2017; this declined to 6,480,204 in 2018 and rose to 6,833,383 in 2019 while those immunized with Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DPT 3) were 239 in 2017 and decreased to 16 each in 2018 and 2019.

3.4 Malaria Cases in Nigeria

Persons with clinically diagnosed Malaria were 4,954,927 in 2017; it declined in 2018 and 2019 to 4,231,185 and 3,588,357 respectively. Persons with confirmed uncomplicated Malaria recorded 13,185,887 in 2017, rose to 14,810,847 in 2018 and 18,602,942 in 2019 was recorded. “Severe Malaria cases seen” recorded 276,425 in 2017, this decreased to 272,717 in 2018 and 268,730 in 2019.




Figure 20: Reported Cases of Pregnant Women with Malaria



3.5 Routine Immunization (RI) Coverage

The percentage of Bacilli Calmette-Guerin (BCG) coverage increased from 60.9 per cent in 2017 to 81.3 per cent in 2018 and 82.3 per cent in 2019. Measles coverage was 65.6 per cent in 2017; it rose to 75.2 per cent and 84.9 per cent in 2018 and 2019 respectively. Yellow Fever coverage was 62.6 per cent in 2017 and increased to 73.3 per cent and 75.3 per cent in 2018 and 2019 respectively. Also, Tetanus Toxoid recorded 47.1 per cent coverage in 2017; this declined to 41.8 per cent in 2018, and rose to 42.3 per cent in 2019. Hepatitis B Virus (HBV) coverage was 55 per cent in 2017, this increased to 56.1 per cent in 2018 and 58.9 per cent in 2019.


Figure 21: Percentage Distribution of Routine Immunization Coverage by Year



3.6 Projected Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Population


Figure 22: Projected HIV Population by Age Group and Year


Figure 23: Percentage of People Aged 15-49 with Knowledge of HIV Prevention by Sex and Year




HUMANITARIAN SERVICE

The turns of events in the face of societal crises that stems from different forms of agitations such as political, religious, tribal and natural disaster has necessitated the establishment of the National Social Investment Programmes (SIP) to tackle poverty and hunger across the country. It also shoulders government intervention to mitigate the economic burden of the poor and vulnerable. The SIP is under the coordination and supervision of the Federal Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs, Disaster Management and Social Development.

4.1 Enrolment on the N-Power Programme

Oyo state has the highest number of persons that were enrolled on the N-power program in 2018 with 19,298, followed by Osun state with 18,730 and Sokoto state was the least with 10,139.


Figure 26: Total Number of Persons Enrolled on the N-Power Programme by State (2018)



4.2 Conditional Cash Transfer (CCT) program



Figure 29: Total Number of Pupils Fed on the School Program by Year





Figure 30: Number of Pupils Fed by the 14 States Involved in 2017


INTERNAL SECURITY AND CRIME

Internal security is the process of keeping peace and maintaining safety within a state or nation, while crime is an action or unlawful act punishable by a state or other authority. The current examples of reported crimes in Nigeria are terrorism, corruption, rape, robbery, kidnapping, banditry etc. This chapter deals mostly with data collected from paramilitary organisations in Nigeria.

5.1 Migration




Figure 32: Arrival and Departure through our Airports by Migrants, Sex and Year




Figure 34: Persons Identified as Victims of Trafficking for Forced Labour


Figure 35: Quantity of Drugs Seized (kg)


Figure 36: Number of Suspects Arrested, Prosecuted and Convicted for Drug Offences by Year


Figure 37: Number of Drug Counselling Cases Reported and Concluded by Year




Figure 39: Total Number of Reported Cases of Vandalization of Government Property and Arrest by Year

JUDICIARY


The Nigeria judiciary is the arm of government responsible for interpretation and application of laws of the land. The judiciary plays other vital roles beyond the interpretation of laws which include dispensation of justice, equity legislation, protection of rights of citizens, the guidance of the constitution as well as other judicial miscellaneous functions. This chapter dwells on the number of cases filed, dispensed of and pending at various Federal Courts in Nigeria.

The Federal judicial power is exercised by the Federal Courts, which adjudicate in disputes arising between individuals, governments and corporate entities in their inter-relationships with one another within or outside the country and under the law, examples of such courts are; The Supreme Court, The Court of Appeal, The Federal High Court etc.

6.1 National Judicial Council

The number of Federal Judicial Officers continuously declined from 2017 to 2019. In 2017 it was 269, but decreased to 267 in 2018 and 253 in 2019.


Figure 41: Number of Federal Judicial Officers by Year



Similarly, in 2017, the petitions received against judicial officers were 353 and the dismissed petitions were 342, while 11 petitions were upheld. In 2018, the petitions received against judicial officers reduced to 300, where 290 petitions were

dismissed and 10 petitions upheld. The petition received against judicial officers further decreased to 146 in 2019, where 107 petitions were dismissed, and 6 were upheld. A total of 33 of the petitions were still pending in 2019.


Figure 42: Total Number of Petitions against Judicial Officers in Nigeria by Year

Figure 43: Total Number of Appeals Filed at the Supreme Court of Nigeria by Year




6.3 Federal High Court

Figure 44: Total Number of Cases Filed, Disposed-of and Pending at the Federal High Court in Nigeria by Year




JUSTICE


Figure 47: Number of Lawyers with the Federal Ministry of Justice as Counsels by Sex and Year



Figure 48: Total Complaints on Goods and Services by Year





OIL AND GAS


Oil and Gas are the major products which are obtained in the petroleum industry. Nigeria is the largest oil and gas producer in Africa. The biggest natural gas initiative is the Nigerian Liquified Natural Gas Company, which is operated jointly by several companies and the Nigerian state.

Oil and Gas is major income earner and contributor to the country's economy. This chapter deals mostly with the prices of oil and gas within the reference period of three years.

8.1 Automotive Gas Oil (Diesel)

The figure below gives insight into the statistics of automotive gas oil (diesel) from 2017 to 2019. The average price of Diesel per litre in 2017 was ₦212.80; it later decreased to ₦210.79 in 2018, and increased in 2019 to ₦227.19.


Figure 51: Yearly Average Price of Diesel per Litre by Year


Figure 53: Average Price Watch of Gas Filling (5kg Cylinder) by Year



8.3 Kerosene




Figure 55: Average Yearly Price of Kerosene per Gallon or 4.5 Litres by Year


POWER GENERATION BY ELECTRICITY GENERATING COMPANY

Electricity in Nigeria is generated through thermal and hydropower sources, with the bulk of the amount of electricity generated coming from thermal. The thermal electricity generation uses the fossil fuels especially gas, the thermal accounts for about 86% of the capacity generation, while the remaining capacity generation comes from hydropower sources.

9.1 Total Electricity Generation (MWh)


Data from the Transmission Company of Nigeria reveals that energy generated per annum was 31,496,047.55 MWh in 2017. There was an increase in energy generation in 2018 and 2019 which is 33,671,808.92 MWh and 33,448,633.87 MWh respectively. Also, in 2019 the energy from companies that were privatised was 19,692,683.9MWh, Independent Power Plants (IPP) was 7,798,252.99 and Nigerian National Integrated Power Project (NIPP) was 5,957,696.98.

Figure 57: Energy (MWh) Generated by Year








Figure 61: Total Amount of Money Given out as Loans for Mortgage by Year




Figure 63: Number of Muslim Pilgrims who Performed Hajj by Year

The total number of Christian pilgrims who performed pilgrimage in 2017, 2018 and 2019 continuously increased from 8,016 (5,100 male and 2,916 female) to 9,561 (5,832 male and 3,729 female) and 9,733 (6,633 male and 3,100 female) respectively.

CHAPTER TWELVE


TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is an essential part of human activity, and in many ways forms the basis of all socio-economic interactions. Indeed, no two locations will interact effectively without a viable means of movement. Transportation is the movement of goods and persons from one point to another. Thus, a good transport system is essential to support economic growth and development. Transport statistics are grouped into four basic categories, namely, Rail, Road, Water and Air transportation.

12.1 Air Transport

Data from the Federal Airport Authority of Nigeria reveals that a total of 12,791,639 passengers travelled domestically in 2018 while 14,083,408 travelled in 2019. Lagos State airport recorded the highest number of travellers in 2018 and 2019 with 4,245,147 and 4,422,023 respectively. Also, Zaria airport has the least in 2018 with 219 while Eket airport has the least in 2019 with 105. (See Table 12.1).

Figure 65: Domestic Air Passenger Movement




Similarly, the passengers that travelled overseas in 2018 were 4,438,799 while 4,654,909 passengers travelled in 2019. (See Table 12.3). In 2018 and 2019 a total of 164,938,399.43kg and 174,880,619.14kg loads were transported respectively.

(See Table 12.5a.). Also, in 2018, a total of 47,318,518.13kg mails were transported while in 2019, it increased to 55,625,908.06kg. (See Table 12.6).

12.2 Rail Transport


The Nigerian Railway Corporation data shows that a total of 2,593,744 passengers travelled in 2017, while 3,019,761 in 2018 and 2,925,342 in 2019. (See Table 12.8.) Fig. 66 shows that 138,678 metric tons of goods were moved in 2017 while 328,634 and 181,285 were moved in 2018 and 2019 respectively.

Train accidents that occurred in 2017 were 506, while in 2018, the number of accidents increased to 523 and declined in 2019 to 357.


Figure 67: Total Train Accident by Year



12.3 Road Transport

The number of reported fatal road traffic crashes in 2017 was 2,587 while in 2018 and 2019 it recorded 2,739 and 2,900 respectively.

In 2017, the total number of reported road crashes in Nigeria was 9,423, this increased in 2018 and 2019 to 9,741 and 11,072 respectively. Meanwhile, out of the total crashes, those reported with serious and light injuries in 2017, 2018 and 2019 were 5,456, 5,849 and 6,911 respectively. (See Table 12.11 and 12.12)

The number of persons killed in road traffic crashes in 2018 was 5,181, this increased in 2019 to 5,483.

Figure 69: Number Killed In Road Traffic Crashes by Year




Similarly, Kaduna state recorded the highest number of deaths from road traffic crashes in 2019 with 484; followed by Ogun State with 364, while Bayelsa state recorded the least with 6 deaths. (See Table 12.15).

Also, the total number of national driver licenses processed in 2019 was 791,627; Lagos state recorded the highest with 791,627, followed by FCT with 84,147 while Kebbi state recorded the least with 1,894. (See Table 12.29).

12.4 Water Transport

The total volume of freight moved through the Nigeria seaports in 2016 was 70,365,036 metric tons, this increased in 2017 and 2018 to 71,535,636 and 73,175,127 respectively.

Similarly, freight volume data shows that Onne port in Rivers state recorded the highest with 75,918,403 metric tons, followed by Lagos port complex with 57,439,817 while the least was Calabar port in Cross River State with 6,770,685 metric tons. (See Table 12.36).

CHAPTER THIRTEEN


WATER RESOURCES

Water has a profound effect on human health both as a means to reduce disease and as a medium through which disease-causing agents may be transmitted". Water quality is, therefore, a key determinant of public health because many life-threatening diseases such as cholera, diarrhoea, dysentery, gastroenteritis and other water-transmitted diseases are ultimately linked to putrid water. Access to safe clean water for all and sound management of freshwater ecosystems are essential to human health, environmental sustainability and economic prosperity.

13.1 Sources of Drinking Water


The households (HHs) that have their water piped into their dwelling in 2019 constitutes 1.6 per cent. Also, the improved water sources that are commonly used by households, tube/borehole has the highest with 38.7 per cent while cart with small tanker/drum has the least with 0.4 per cent.

Figure 71 Percentage of Households Main Source of Drinking Water




In addition, the households that are using unimproved water sources have unprotected dug well as the highest with 11.8 per cent, while the least was other sources with 1.1 per cent.

Similarly, households whose sources of drinking water was less than 100m in 2019 were 54.9 per cent, while those with sources more than 4km away were 1.1 per cent.

13.2 Time-Use for Fetching Water

Nationally, in 2019 the average time household spent fetching water for drinking was 19 minutes, with an average of 5 trips. (See Table 13.4).

Also, the number of households that improved their water quality for safe drinking in 2019 was 63.7 per cent, and those who do not improve at all was 36.3 per cent. The majority of the households (62.8 per cent) practice the “let it stand and settle” approach for safe drinking water. North-west was the highest zone to improve their water quality for safe drinking with 76.3 per cent while the least was South-West with 50.2 per cent. (See Table 13.8).

Generally, 29.9 per cent of households contributed cash for the construction of the water facility they are using, while 18.6 per cent contributed in kind and 9.3 per cent contributed in both cash and kind.
