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# PREFACE



The growing interest and need for data on Nigeria, in recent times, has resulted mainly from concerns on the part of policymakers, investors, businesses and citizens regarding the socio-economic conditions that face the Nigerian population. As the coordinator of the National Statistical System (NSS) and authoritative source of official statistics in Nigeria, the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) has the statutory mandate of meeting this demand by providing accurate, timely and reliable official statistics.

The Social Statistics Report 2017, builds on similar previous efforts to assess socio-economic indicators on Nigeria by reviewing developments during the period 2014, 2015 and 2016. It has been produced to meet NBS' specific mandate of collecting, collating, analysing and disseminating statistical information on all facets of national life, while also reflecting the coordinating role that NBS plays in its relationship with federal and state ministries, departments or agencies (MDAs).

The Report, comprising of Part I: Summary Report and Part II: Statistical Appendix, is a compilation of data on the contemporary socio-economic situation in Nigeria. While it does not cover every single topic or sector, or represent the totality of available social statistics, it does present a variety of pertinent social and economic statistics and is indicative of what is available within the Bureau's data systems, both online and in print. Data for this publication was mainly generated from administrative sources, routinely collected from Federal Ministries, Departments and Agencies.

In terms of structure, this summary report has been divided into sixteen chapters covering agriculture, civil service, communication, culture & tourism, education, elections, energy & environment, public finance, health, judiciary, labour, petroleum, security, transport and youth. I wish to acknowledge the support of the Planning, Research and Statistics Department of relevant MDAs in supplying data for the compilation of this report. While there are on-going efforts to further streamline the administrative data collection process, it is our expectation that more sectors will be covered in the future, and MDAs that have pending data submissions will be able to make necessary updates by the next reporting cycle.

I am confident that this publication, together with the statistical appendix, will go a long way in meeting the needs of policy makers, researchers, students, social advocates and other relevant stakeholders to formulate policies and strategies as well as track changes on various dimensions of socio-economic conditions in Nigeria. It is therefore my pleasure to present this edition of Social Statistics Report 2017 to the various users. We welcome any suggestions and contributions that will help in improving future compilations.

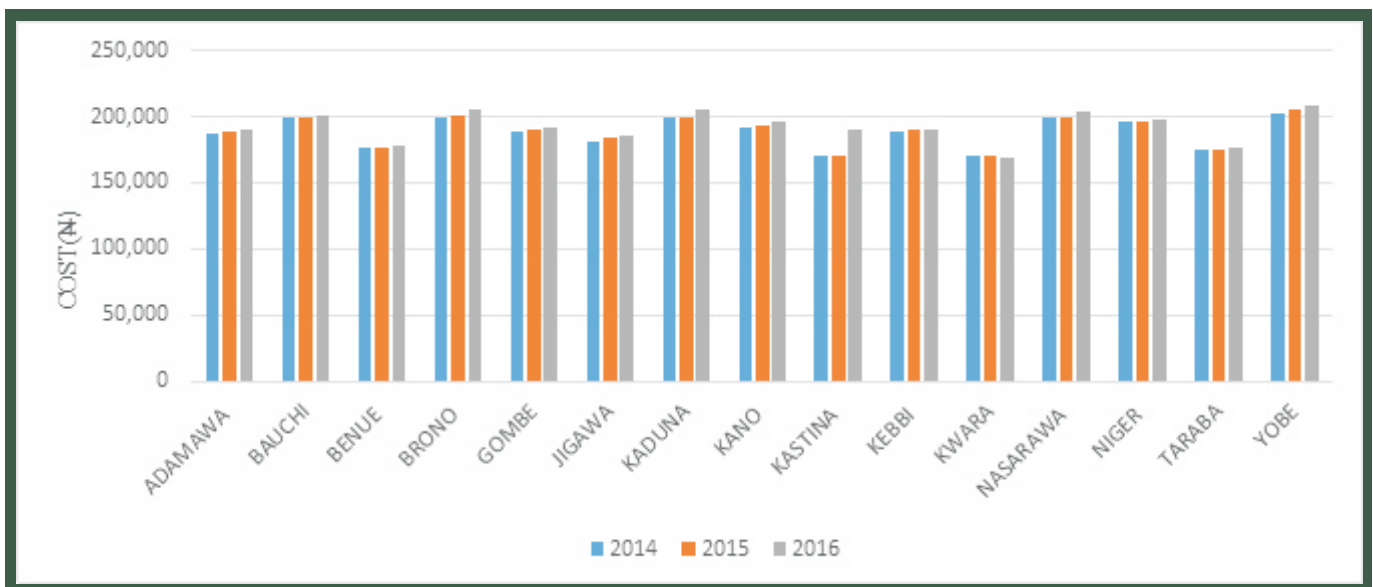
# CHAPTER ONE

## Agriculture

Agricultural production is key to the overall well being of the population. As a result, a lot of importance is placed on agriculture in order to develop and protect the sector, thereby guaranteeing sustainable food security, employment opportunities, source of livelihood, contribution to national income, source of raw materials among others. Agriculture, for decades, had been associated with the production of basic food crops. Agriculture in Nigeria is a sector of the economy which provides employment for about 17% of the population. The sector is being transformed by commercialization at the small, medium and large scale enterprise levels. This chapter deals with the cost of production per hectre of some crops in Nigeria.

Figure 1.1 shows the cost (₦) per hectare of producing groundnut in 15 Northern states of Nigeria from 2014-2016. In 2016, the highest cost was recorded in Yobe State at the cost of ₦209,000 while the lowest in the same year was in Kwara State at the cost of ₦169,000. The three States of Borno, Kaduna and Nasarawa recorded the same cost of production per hectare at ₦200,000 each in 2014.

Table 1.1 shows the average cost per hectare of rice production in Nigeria (2014-2016). In 2015 and 2016, the average cost was N180,000 and N197,000 per hectare respectively.

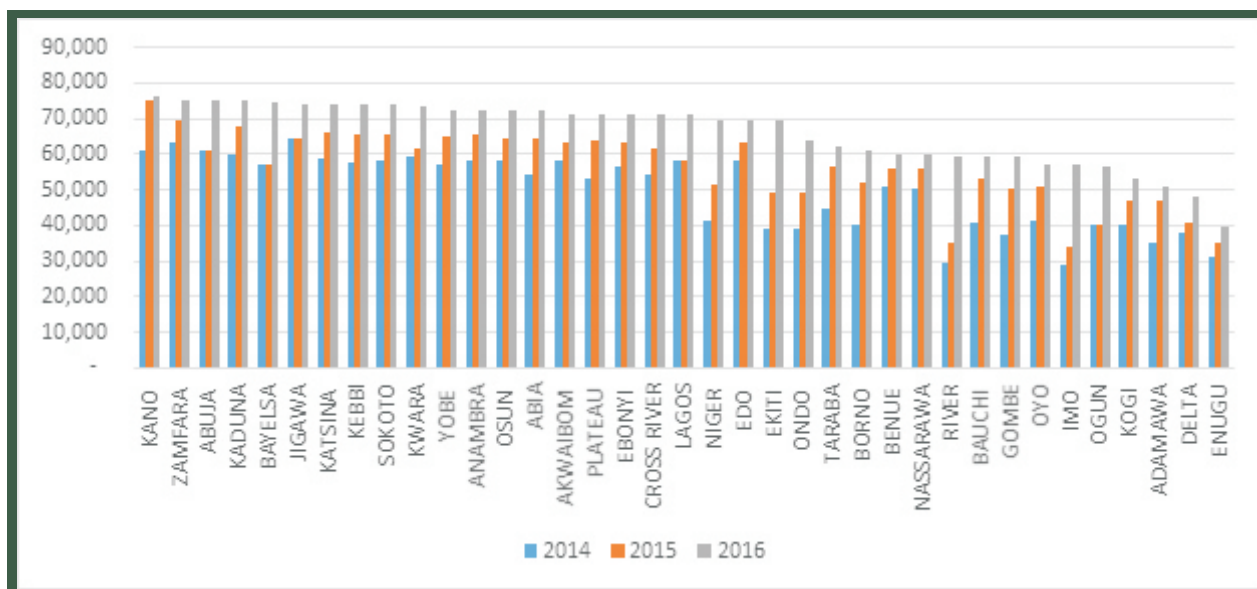

Figure 1.2 shows the cost(₦) per hectare of maize production in Nigeria (2014-2016). The cost of maize production in Lagos State increased from ₦58,000 in 2015 to ₦71,000 in 2016 which is a 22.4 percent increase. In Zamfara State the cost increased from ₦69,300 in 2015 to ₦75,200 in 2016 which amount to 8.5 percent increase. In 2016, the highest cost of production per hectare was recorded in Kano State at the cost of ₦76,200 while the least cost was in Enugu State at ₦39,600.

# CHAPTER TWO

## Corruption

The problem of corruption is arguably one of the most significant global issues in the contemporary world. In the last three decades, in particular, international attention has been focused on the challenges of corruption. Recently, the international community has recognized its harmful impact by including a specific target to fight corruption in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Corruption is the bane of any progressive society. It stifles entrepreneurship, professionalism and erodes the values of hard work and honesty, and is one of the root causes of under-development in our society. Sadly, Nigeria as a country has experienced this menace for a long time but now appears to be tackling it head on.

This chapter deals with corruption related data that is generated from the activities of Independent Corrupt Practices Commission (ICPC), Code of Conduct Bureau (CCB) and from a report released by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), in collaboration with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) in July, 2017.

Table 2.1 shows the number of political office holders who declared their assets (2012-2014). There was an increase in the number of political office holders who declared their assets from 7,602 in 2012 to 9,271 in 2013 and 12,985 in 2014. This was an increase of 22 and 40 percent respectively.

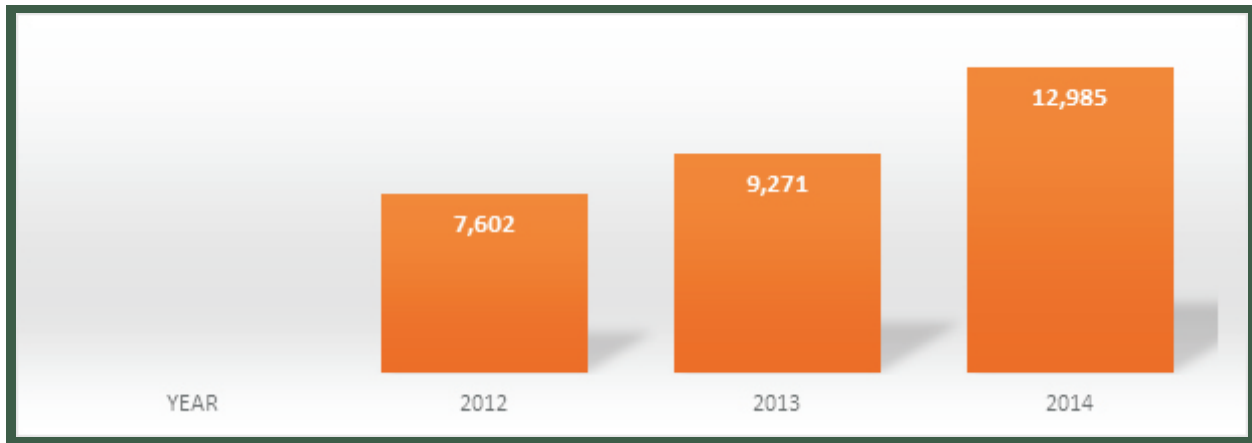

FIG.2.2: TOTAL NUMBER OF REPORTED CASES OF CORRUPTION BY STATE AND YEAR (2015-2016)

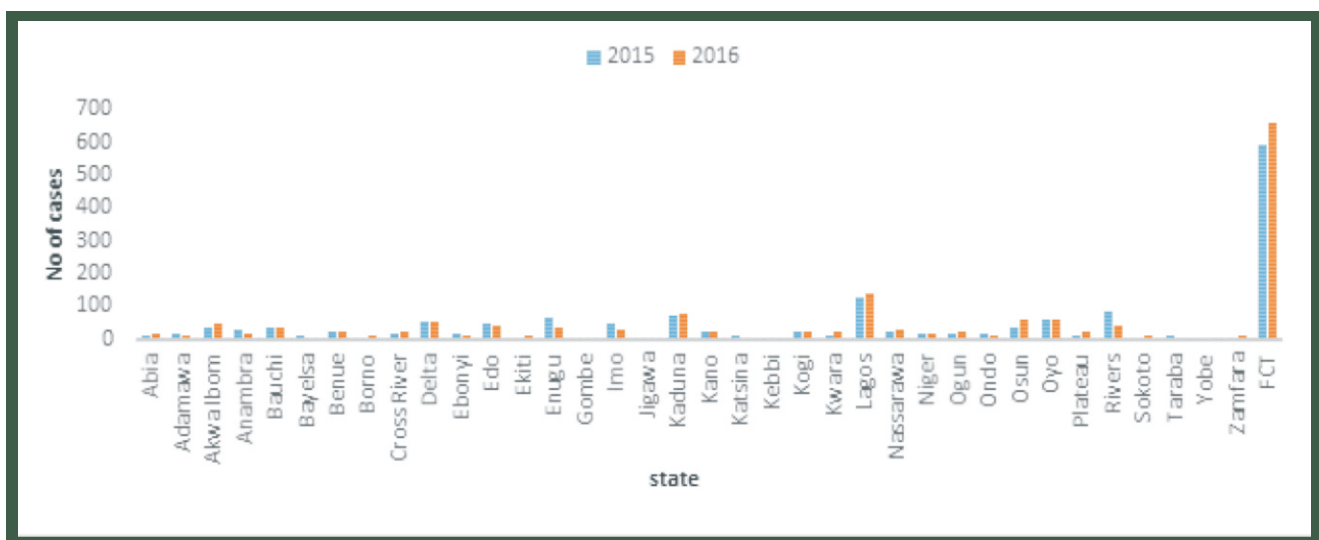


Table 2.2 shows percentage distribution of bribes in Nigeria by types of request and year. Direct request from the official was 65.4 percent, while indirectly request a payment recorded 19.9 percent. Bribe request where nobody asked for it, I did it to facilitate/accelerate the procedure was 8.2 percent.

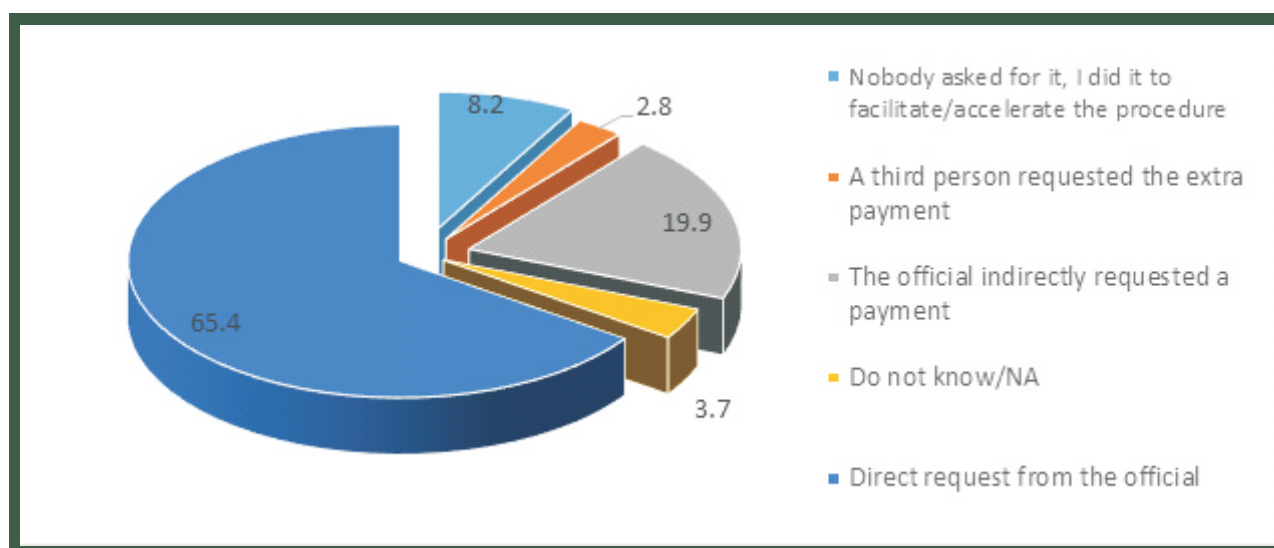


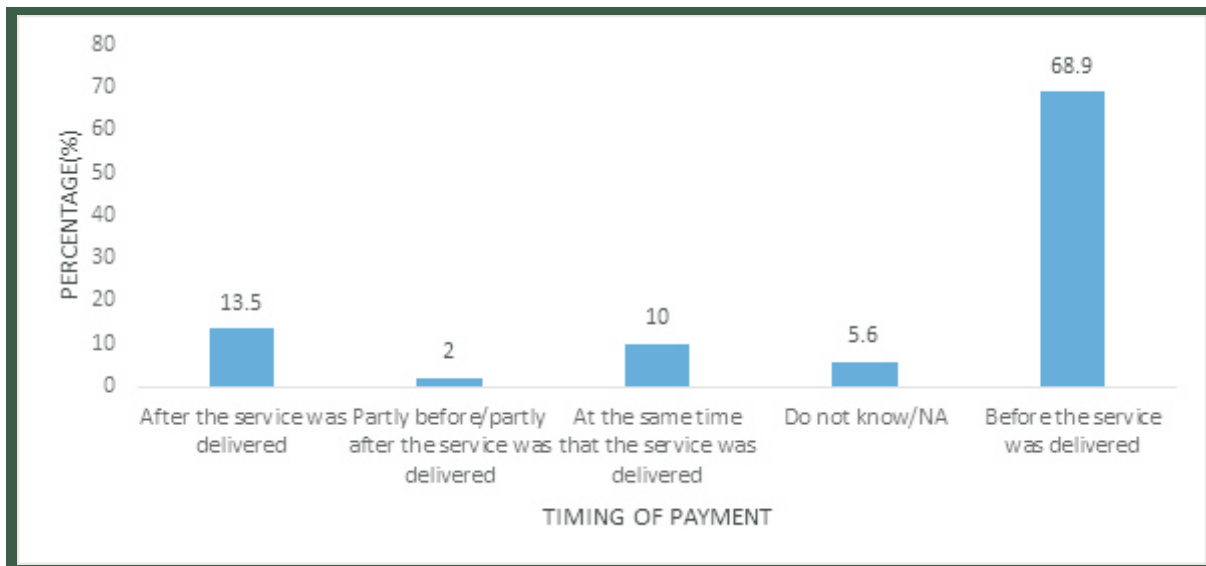
Table 2.3 shows percentage distribution of bribes in Nigeria by timing of payment and year. Almost 70 per cent of bribes were paid before service was delivered, while 13.5 percent were paid after service was delivered. The percentage of bribes collected at the same time that the service was delivered was 10 percent, while those who paid partly before/ after the service was delivered was 2 percent.

# CHAPTER THREE

## Civil Service

The Nigerian civil service is an important instrument of the Federal government that provides platform for continued social development and the sustainability of governance in the society. The government relies on the civil service to carry out the policy of the state. The civil service consists of employees in Nigerian government agencies other than the military. Career progression in service is based on qualifications and seniority. The Nigerian civil service consists of many personnel with technical skills which provide capacity for implementation of government programmes. In this chapter, data on Federal Civil Service Commission employment by year is presented.

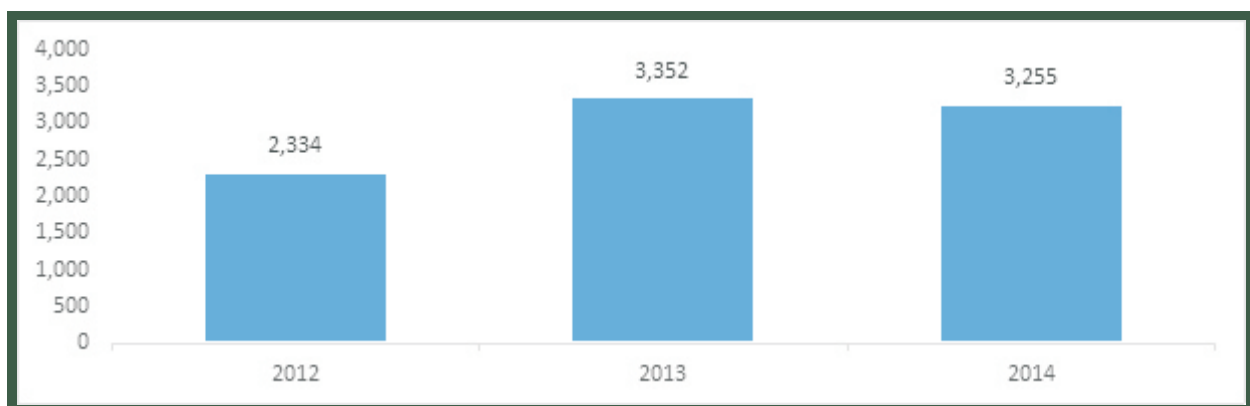
In 2012, a total of 2,334 employees were added, 3,352 in 2013, and 3,255 in 2014.

# CHAPTER FOUR

## Communication

One of the sectors that enhance and facilitate development in the country is the telecommunication sector. Telecommunication transmit signs, signals, messages, words, writings, images and sounds or information of any nature by *wire*, *radio*, optical or other *electromagnetic* systems. It occurs when there is an exchange of *information* between *communication* participants through the use of *technology*. This has brought about an immense transformation to Nigeria's economy as information is easily disseminated both locally and globally. The communication sector in Nigeria comprises radio, television, fixed and mobile telephones, postal services and the internet. Telecommunication facilities constitute critical parts of infrastructure in Nigeria and determine the efficiency of the communication system. This chapter presents data on both the accessibility and usage of telecommunication via phone calls and use of internet.

Table 4.1 shows the total distribution of mobile subscription (2014-2016). In 2015 GSM subscription was 148,681,362 which increased to 154,124,602 (3.7 per cent) in 2016, while CDMA had 2,148,727 in 2015 but declined to 217,566 in 2016.

Fig. 4.1 shows the internet subscription for the year 2015-2016. There was a decrease in GSM internet subscription from 97,032,543 in 2015 to 91,880,032 in 2016 while in case of CDMA, internet subscription decreased from 150,212 in 2015 to 30,309 in 2016.

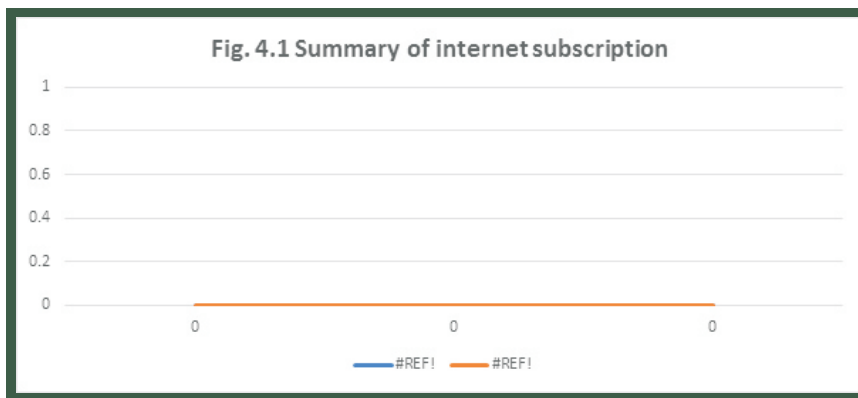


Fig. 4.2 shows the porting activity for the year 2015 -2016. Incoming porting activity decreased from 17,742 in 2015 to 14, 059 in 2016 while the outgoing porting activity decreased from 17,758 in 2015 to 13,585 in 2016.

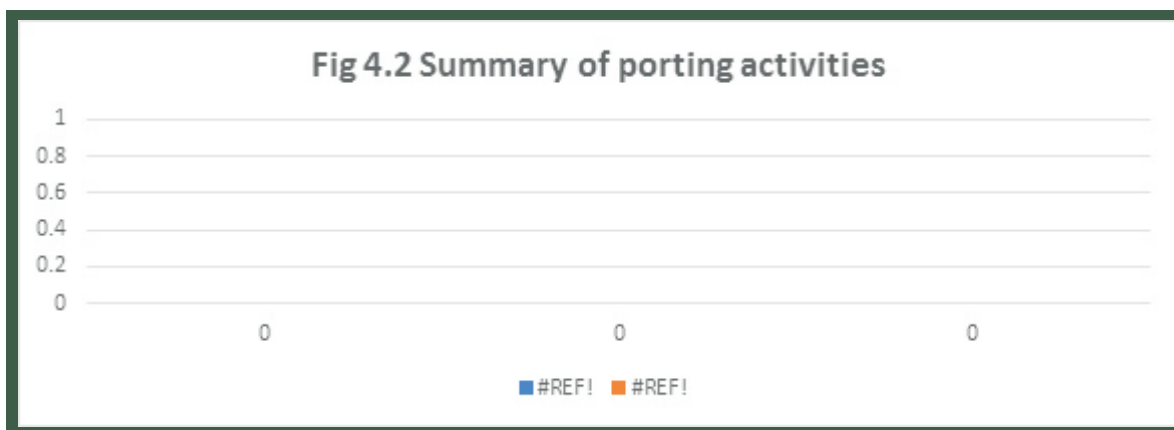

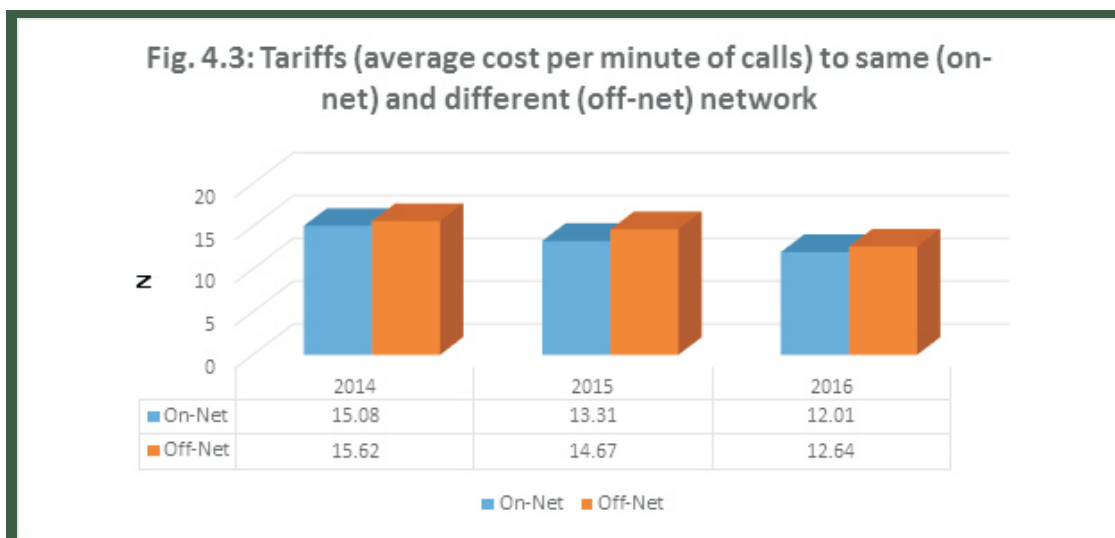

Figure 5.2 shows the number of muslim pilgrims who absconded by state in 2014 to 2016. In 2014, 1 person each from Nasarawa and Zamfara states absconded. Though there was no record of any pilgrim that absconded in 2015, a total number of 78 pilgrims was recorded in 2016. Yobe state recorded the highest number (28) of absconded pilgrims in 2016, while Abia, Gombe and Sokoto states recorded the least with 1 pilgrimeach.

FIG 5.2: NUMBER OF MUSLIM PILGRIMS WHO ABSCONDED DURING HAJJ BY STATE AND YEAR

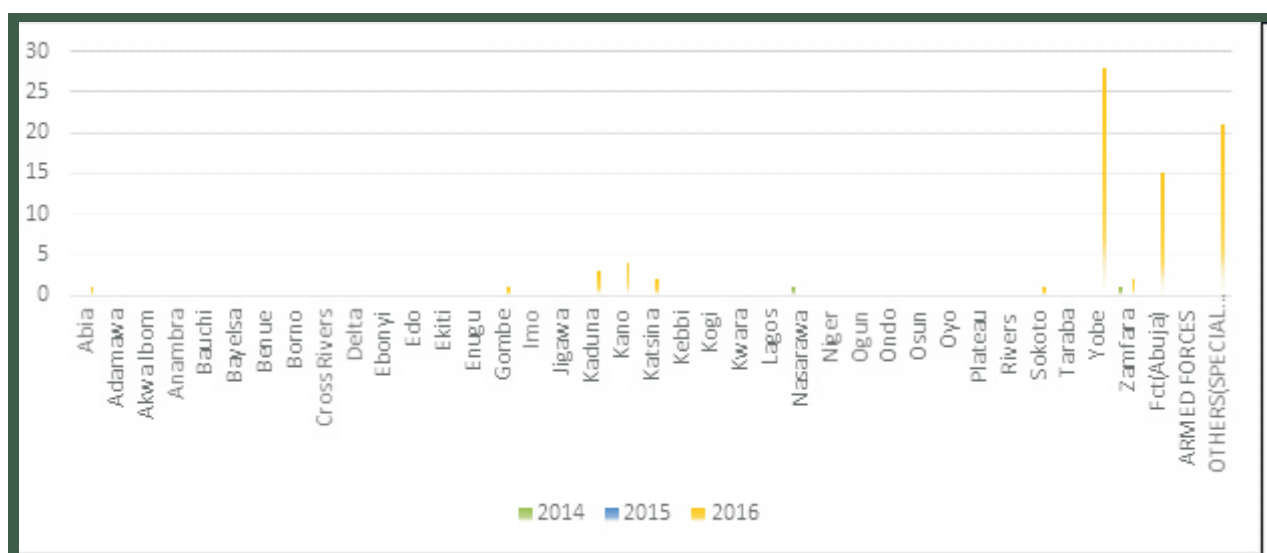


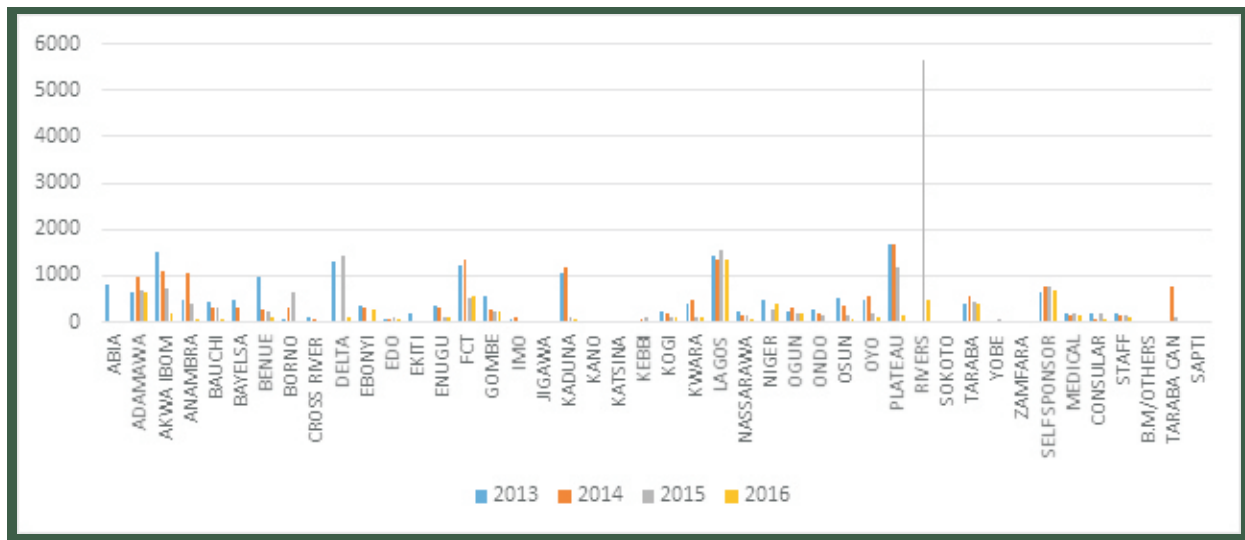
Table 5.2 provides information on the number of christian pilgrims by sex and year. There was a downward trend in the number of pilgrims for both sexes from 8,939 males and 7,022 females in 2014 to 4,143 and 3,057 respectively in 2016.

Figure 5.3 shows the number of Christian pilgrims by state and year. In 2015, Rivers state had the highest number of pilgrims with 5,660, followed by Lagos and Delta with 1,563 and 1,438 respectively. Lagos state however, had the highest in 2016 with 1,332 followed by those who sponsored themselves (self-sponsor) and Adamawa with 671 and 664 respectively.

# CHAPTER SIX

## Education Statistics

Education plays a very vital role in the growth and development of a nation. It is also very important for character building which in turn becomes vital for nation building. To give a historical perspective of developments in education over the years in Nigeria, the data on major education indicators are provided.

Most of the items of data on education presented in this chapter are sex and state specific.

Table 6.1 presents the national summary of public Early Childhood Curriculum Development Education (ECCDE) and one-year pre-primary enrolment by class, sex and year (2013/14 - 2015/16). During the period, there was an increase in total enrolment from 2,738,851 in 2013/14 to 4,672,908 in 2014/15 but later decreased to 2,721,736 in 2015/16. Across all three categories of kindergarten, nursery and 1 year pre-primary, there were more male pupils.

Table 6.2 shows national summary of private Early Childhood Curriculum Development Education (ECCDE) and 1 year Pre-primary enrolment by class, sex and year from 2013/14 to 2015/16. There was an increase from 1,547,897 in 2013/14 to 2,076,420 in 2014/15 and later decreased to 1,457,461 in 2015/16.

Table 6.3 shows the total distribution of National Examination Council (NECO) results for June/July by sex and subject from 2014 to 2016. A total of 978,886 candidates sat for the examination in 2014, the number decreased to 969,490 candidates in 2015 indicating a 0.96 per cent decrease and increased to 1,022,474 candidates in 2016, indicating a 5.5 per cent increase respectively.

A total of 398,190 males and 314,954 females passed the examination with five credits including Mathematics and English language in 2016.

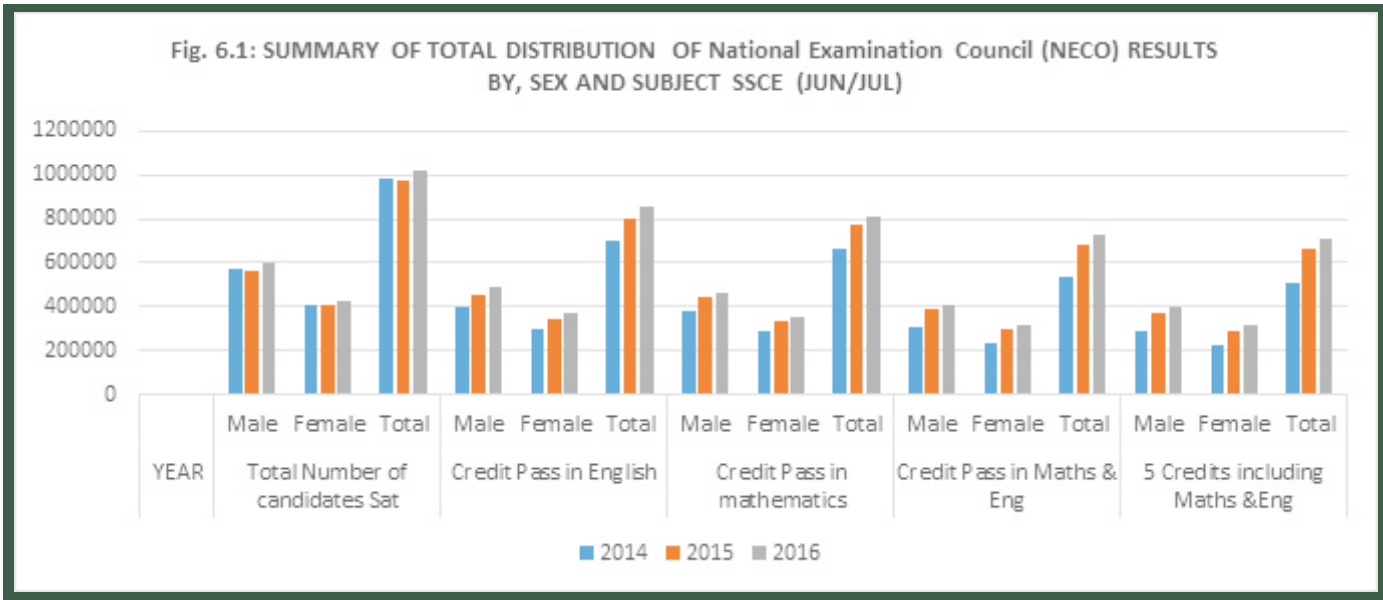


Table 6.4 shows the total distribution of National Examination Council (NECO) results by, sex and subject SSCE (November/December, 2014-2016). The total number of candidates who sat for NECO recorded a steady decrease from 61,386 in 2014 to 49,084 and 47,118 in 2015 and 2016 respectively. The total number of students who passed the examinations with five credits including Mathematics and English Language in the three years under review were 13,832, 15,788 and 28,530 respectively.

In the years under review, 2016 recorded the highest percentage of candidates who sat for the examination and passed with minimum of five credits with (male) 59.17 per cent and (female) 62.46 per cent, followed by 2015 with (male) 30.33 per cent and female 34.70 per cent while the least was in 2014 with (male) 20.09 per cent and (female) 26.34 per cent.

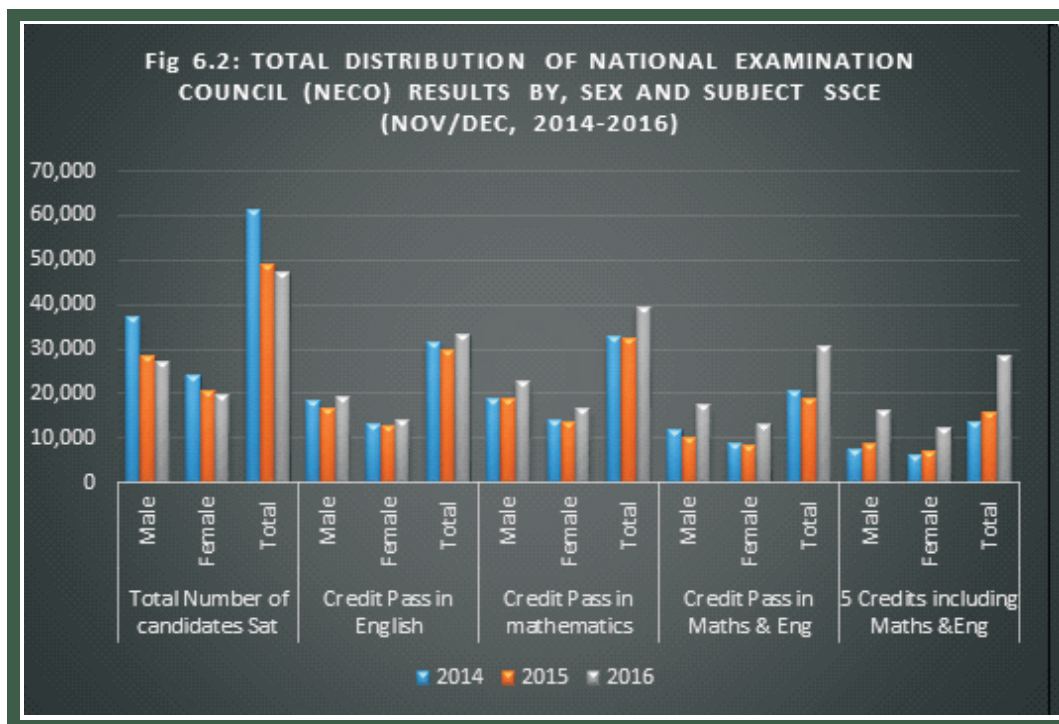


Table 6.5 shows polytechnic enrolment summary by institutions in two academic years, 2013/2014 and 2014/2015. Data from NBTE indicates that enrolment by institution increased from 288,974 in 2013/2014 to 290,697 in 2014/2015 academic year. It also shows that male enrolment was higher in both sessions with male having about 60% of the total enrolment.

# CHAPTER SEVEN

## Election Statistics

Elections enhance democratic governance. It is the formal process of selecting a person for public office or of accepting or rejecting a political proposition by voting. Regular and periodic elections help to solve problems of succession in leadership and thus contribute to the continuation of democracy. It is from credible elections that, the Executive, Legislative, State and Local government offices are filled. This chapter captures data on the legislators at the National Assembly, principal offices occupied and number of seats held in Nigeria.

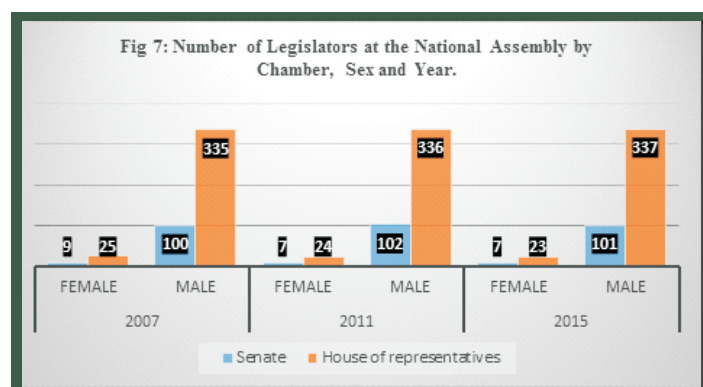
Table 7 gives the number of legislators in the National Assembly by chamber, sex and election years of 2007, 2011 and 2015. Over the years under review, the trend shows an increase for males, while females were the opposite. This implies that there were more male legislators at the National Assembly than females. In 2011, females accounted for 31 legislators (House of Representative 24 and Senate 7) but 30 in 2015 (about 7% of total number of legislators).

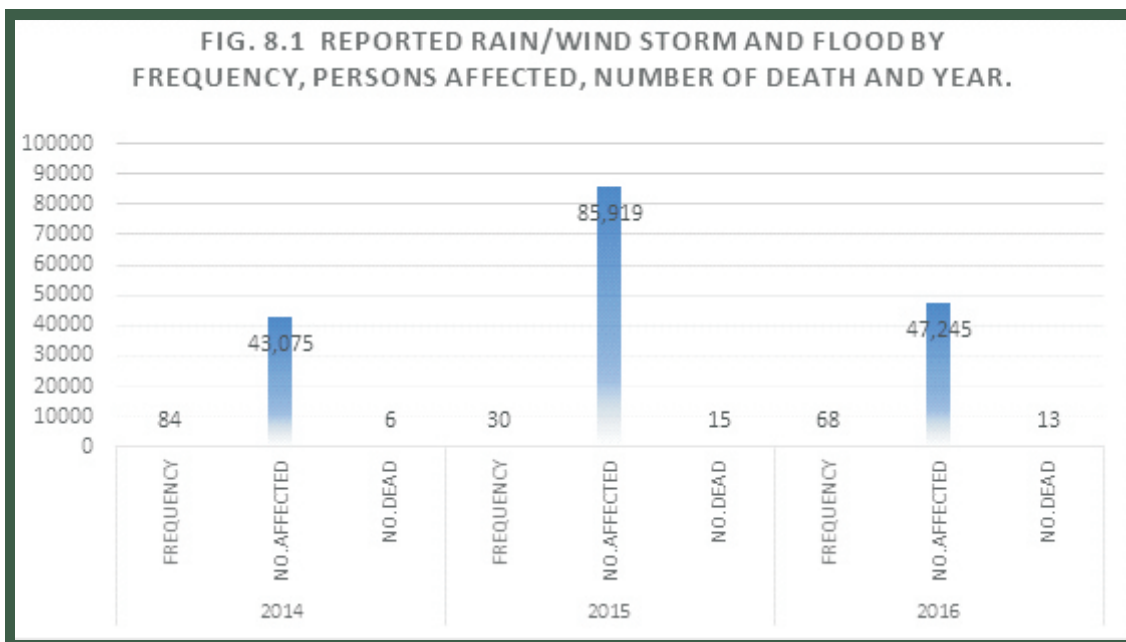
# CHAPTER EIGHT

## Energy And Environment

The importance of energy and environment cannot be over emphasized in attaining sustainable development. Energy is the catalyst of development and every other activity revolves round it. This chapter presents data on reported rain/wind storm, flood and fire disaster.

Fig. 8.1 shows reported rain/wind storm and flood by frequency, persons affected and number of deaths from 2014 to 2016. The occurrence of rain/wind storm and flood recorded in 2014 was 84, 30 in 2015 and 68 in 2016. Though 2015 had lower number of occurrences, it recorded a high number of affected persons with 85,919. The proportion of death to number of persons affected in 2016 was 0.03 percent compared to 0.02 percent in 2015.

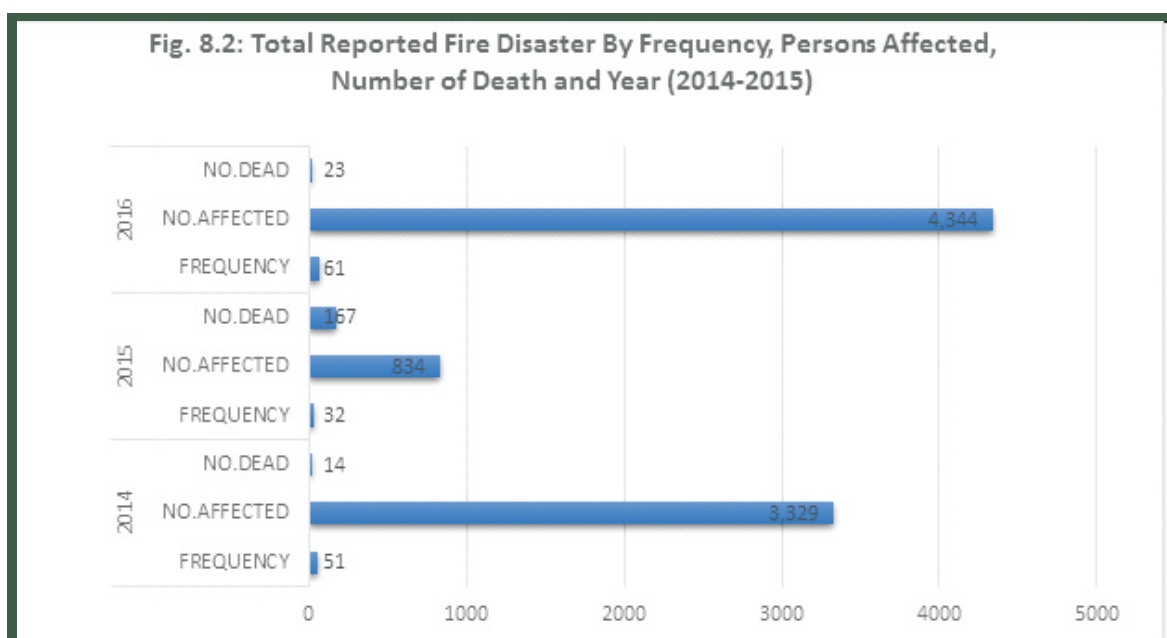

# CHAPTER NINE

## Public Finance

Public finance in terms of public revenue and expenditure has a direct relationship with economic growth and development. Government uses the annual budget to set up expenditure and revenue targets to realise its policy objectives of achieving efficient allocation of resources, equitable distribution of income and macroeconomic stability. Government financial account statistics shows data on various types and forms of revenue and expenditure of Government.

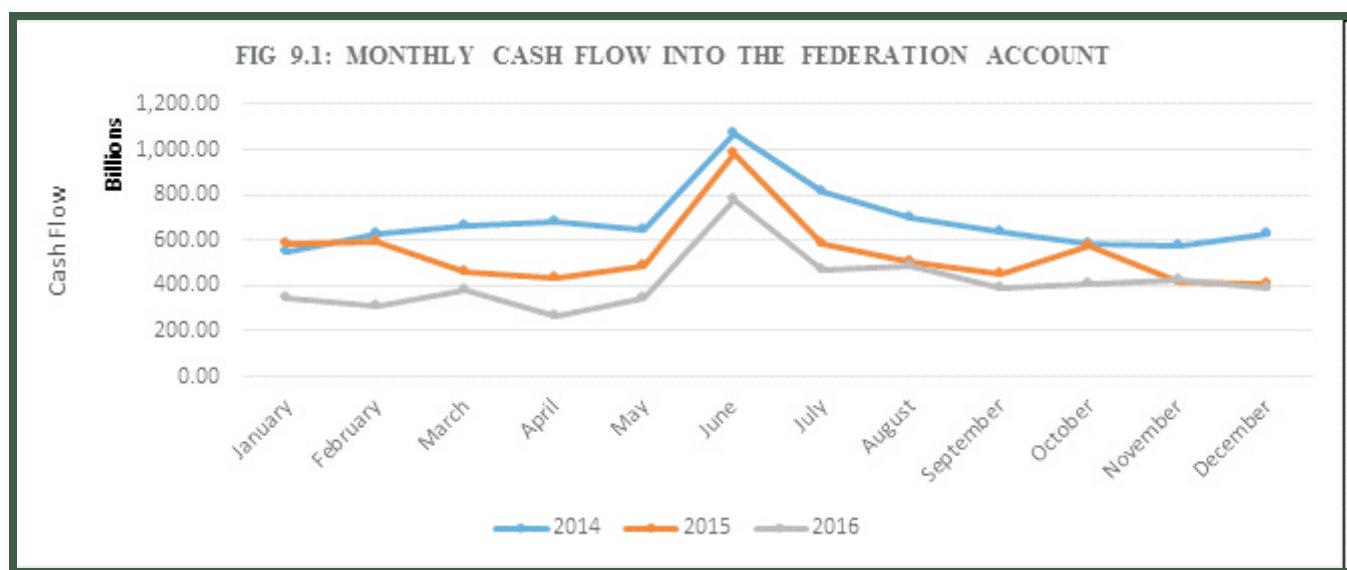

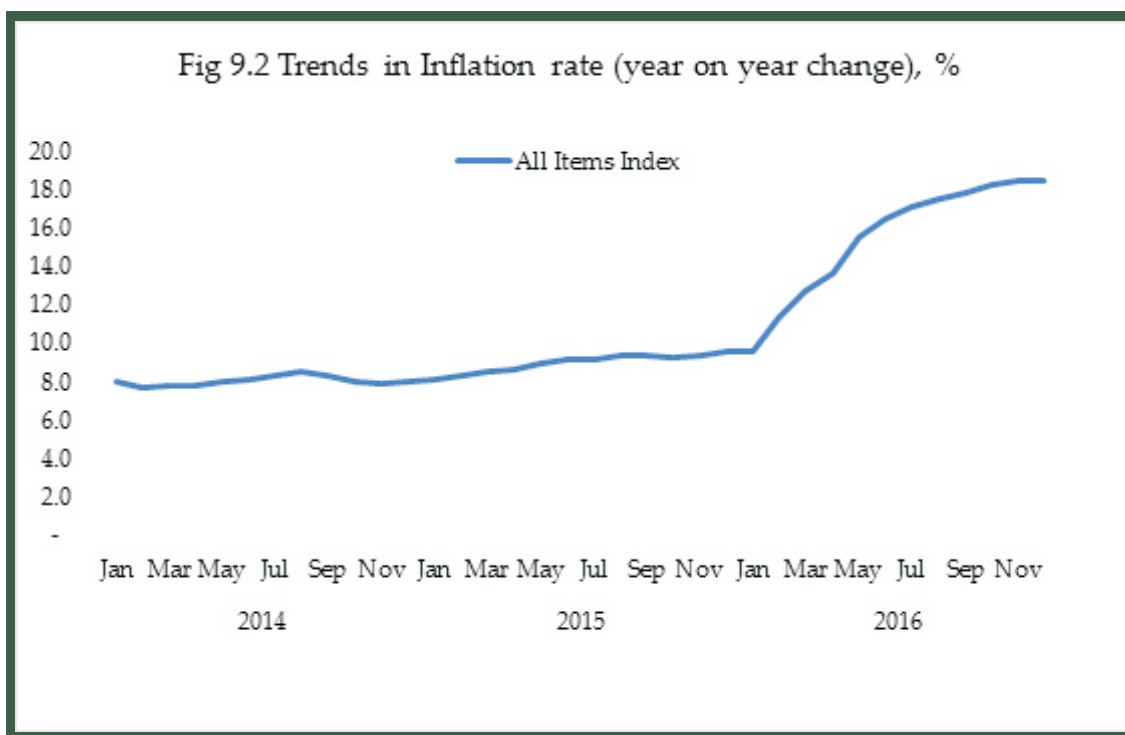

# CHAPTER TEN

## HEALTH

Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social wellbeing and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity (WHO). According to the WHO, the higher a person's socioeconomic status (SES), the more likely they are to enjoy good health, a good education, a well-paid job, afford good healthcare. The role of health in national development cannot be overemphasised. It is one of the indices that determine production capacity of the county's labour force which in turn leads to the growth and development of the economy. The main sources of data for this chapter are derived from Federal Ministry of Health, National Agency for Food and Drug Administration and Control (NAFDAC), Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria, National Agency for the Control of AIDS/HIV (NACA), National AIDS and STDs Control Programme (NASCP), National Malaria Elimination Programme (NMEP) and Nigeria Centre for Disease Control.

Table 10.1 shows the total number of HIV patients in Nigeria by states for year 2014 to 2016. The total number of HIV patients rose from 3,145,710 in 2014 to 3,173,040 in 2015 (0.87 percent), then to 3,200,098 in 2016 (0.85 percent).. As shown in Fig.10.1, Akwa Ibom had the highest with 227,028 followed by Plateau with 212,600 while Ekiti recorded the least with 5,025 in 2016

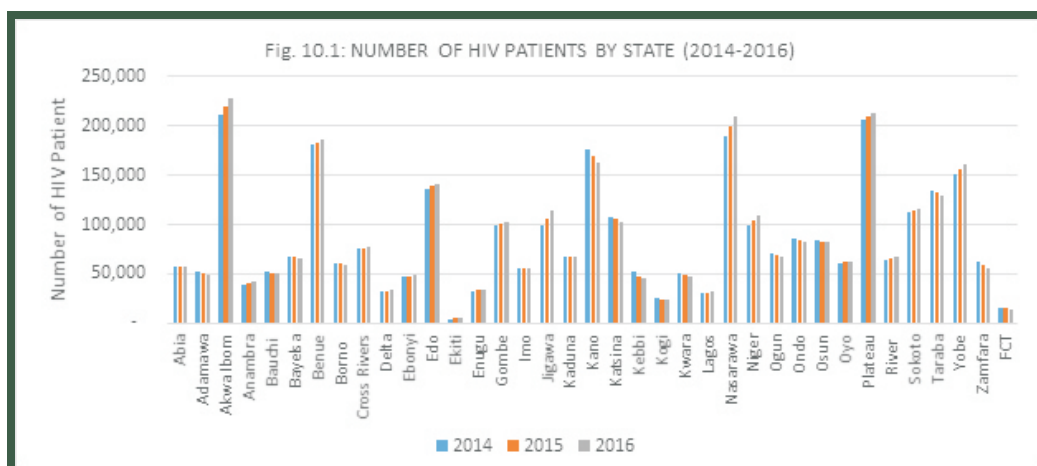

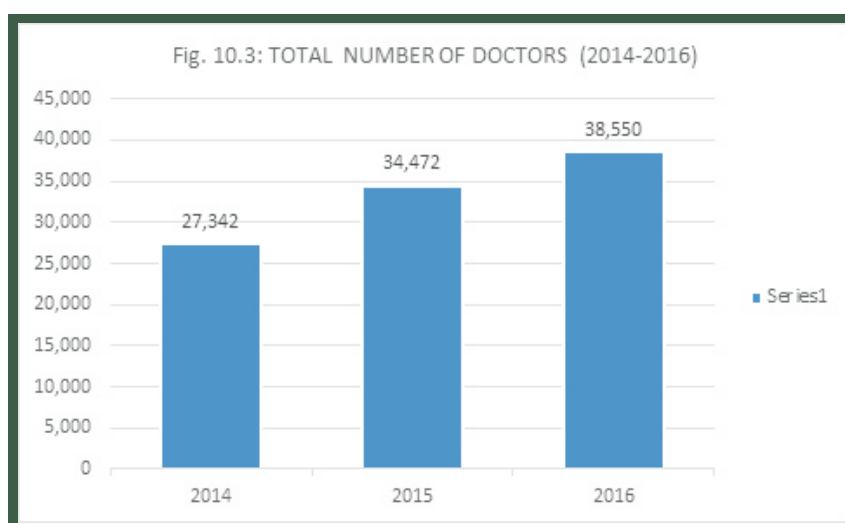
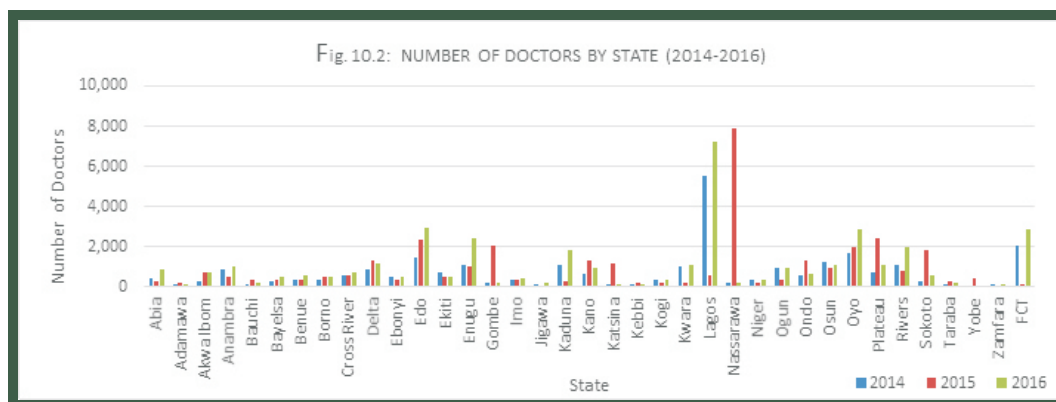

Fig. 10.4 TOTAL NUMBER OF DENTISTS IN NIGERIA (2014-2016)

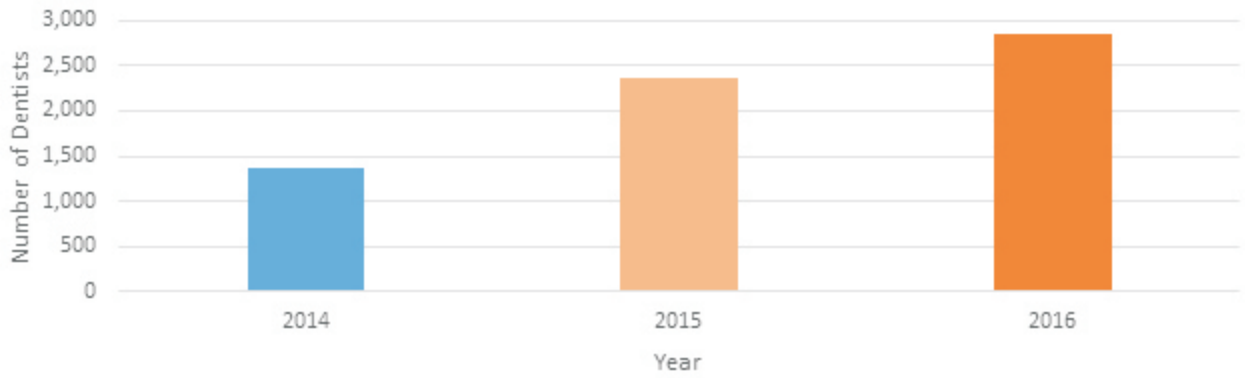


Fig. 10.5: NUMBER OF DENTISTS BY STATE (2014-2016)

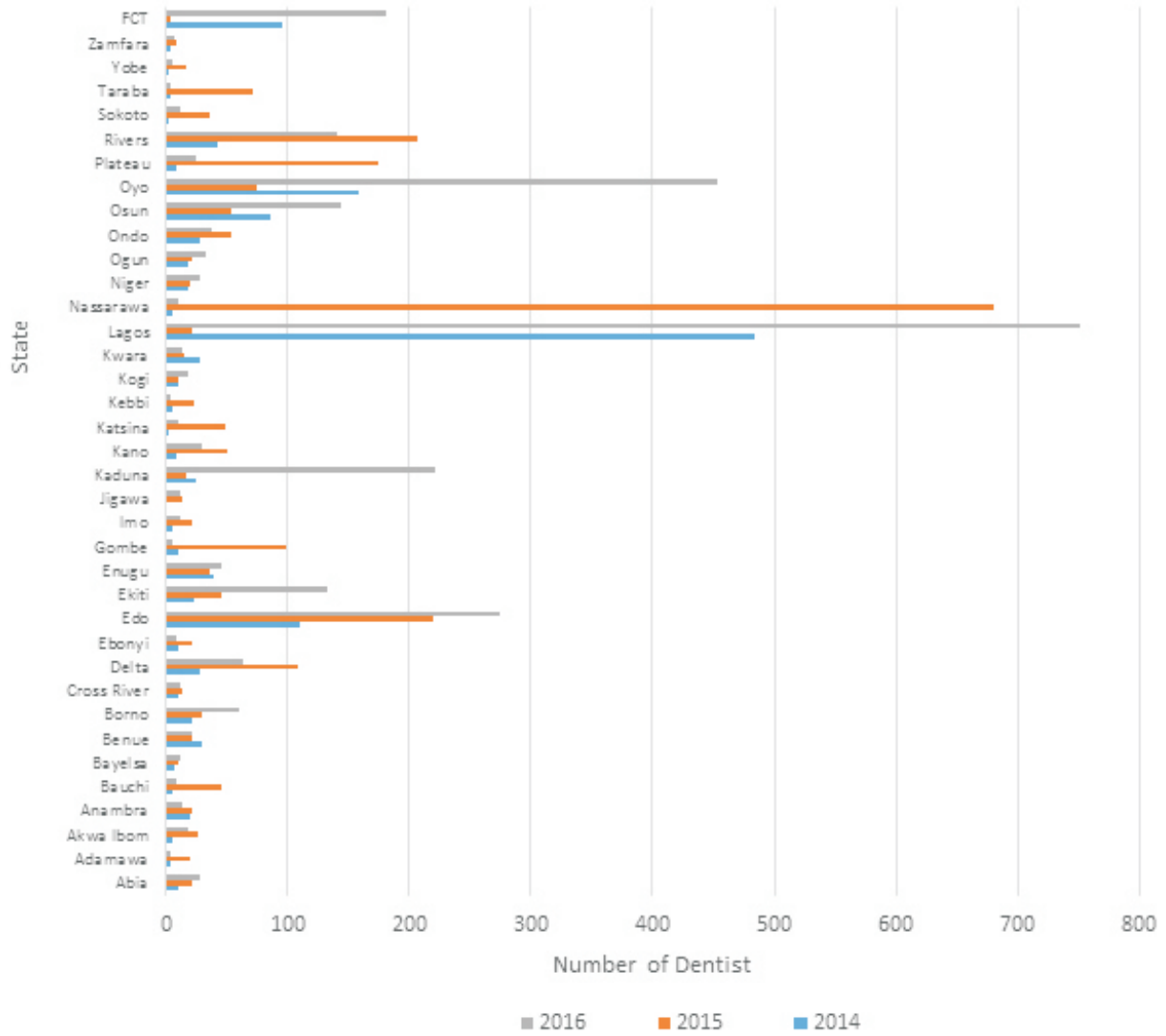

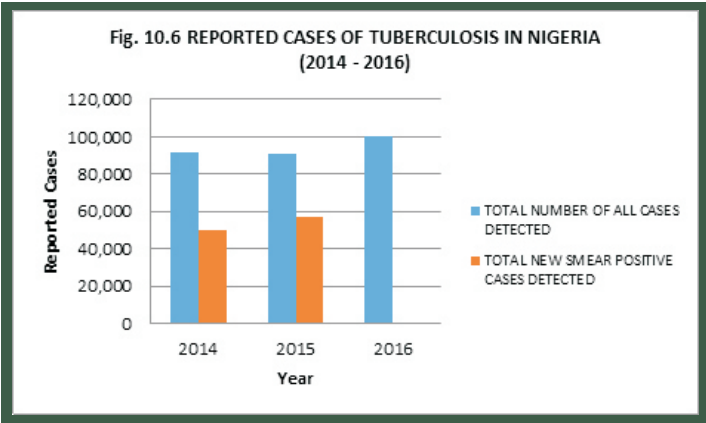

# CHAPTER ELEVEN

## JUDICIARY

The judiciary is the branch of authority in a country which is concerned with law and the legal system. It is the system of courts that interprets and applies the law in the name of the state. The judiciary also provides a mechanism for the resolution of disputes. In Nigeria, the federal judicial power is exercised by the Federal and State courts which adjudicate in disputes arising between individuals, government and corporate entities in their inter-relationship with one another within or outside the country in accordance with the law.

This chapter shows data on the number of bills handled by stage of bills, drafted bill instructions handled by quarter, source and the summary of petition received by nature of petition.

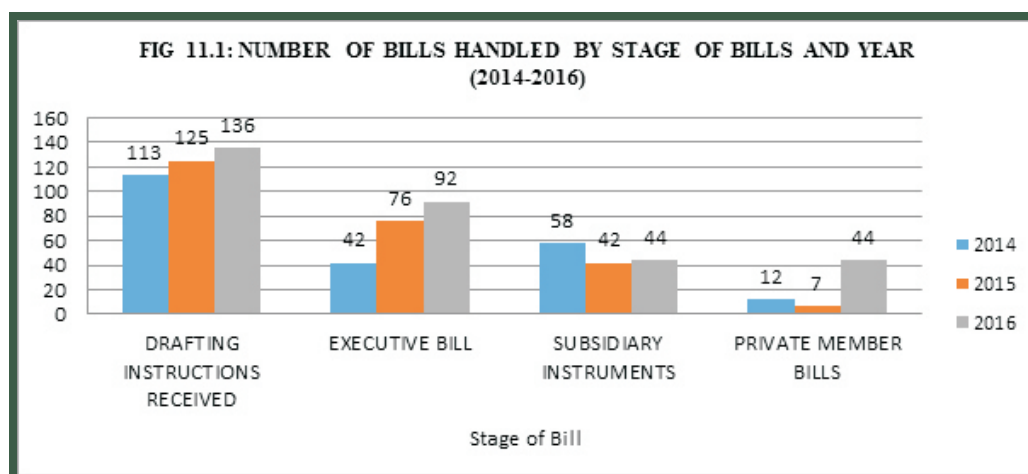

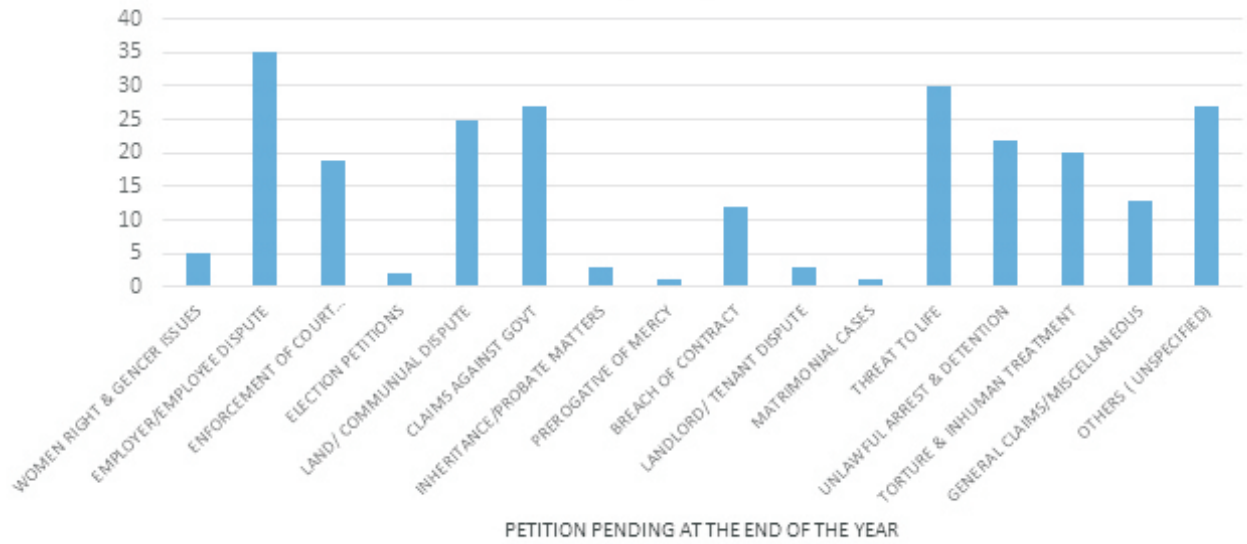

# CHAPTER TWELVE

## LABOUR

Labour is a primary factor of production. The size of a nation's labour force is determined by the size of its adult population and the extent to which the adults are either working or are prepared to offer their labour for wages. The International Labour Organization defines labour force as all people ages 15 to 65 years, who supply labour for the production of goods and services during a specified period. In Nigeria, some sectors of the Labour force have people of ages 18 to 70 years.

Table 12.1 shows the percentage distribution of unemployment and under-employment by quarter and year (2014-2016). Unemployment rate rose from 7.8% at the beginning of 2014, and rose to 14.2% at the end of 2016. Under-employment rate was however much higher and rose more slowly from 17.5% to 21.0% over the same period.

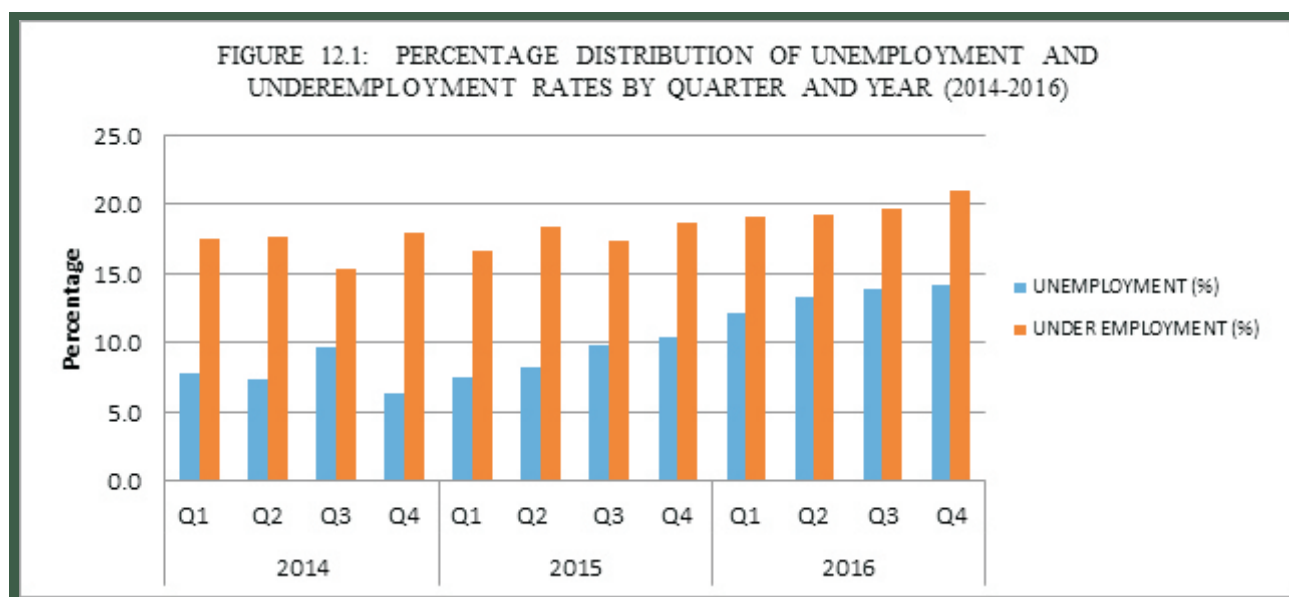
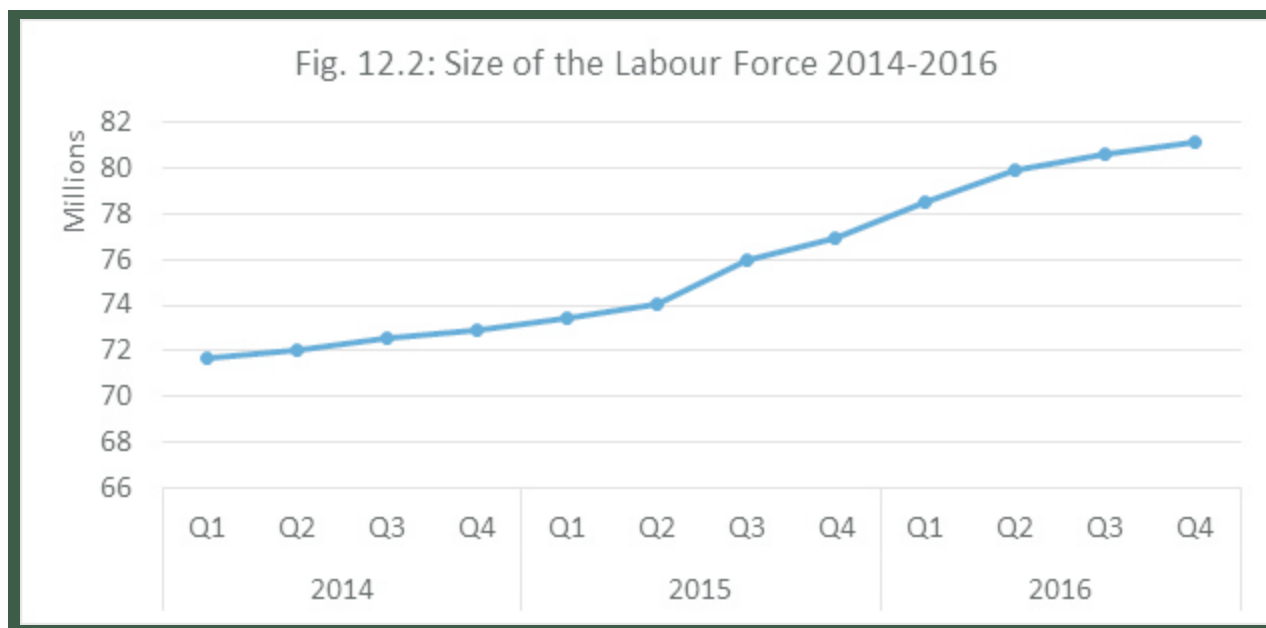

# CHAPTER THIRTEEN

## PETROLEUM

The petroleum industry in Nigeria is often seen as the backbone of the economy. Government revenues and foreign exchange still heavily rely on petroleum sector; it therefore plays an integral role in the socio-economic development of Nigeria. This chapter provides data on crude oil production by activities, natural gas production and disposal, crude oil production and export, amount of finished products from domestic refineries, etc. The data was provided by the Ministry of Petroleum Resources.

Table 13.1: shows Nigeria natural gas production and disposal by activity (2014 - 2016). In 2014, the total Gas produced was 2,524,268,444 mscf, this increased to 3,003,179,000 mscf (19 percent) in 2015 which later decreased to 2,711,803,036 mscf (10 percent) in 2016. Gas utilized was 2,234,668,430 mscf in 2014, increased to 2,672,247,000 mscf (20 percent) in 2015, then decreased to 2,404,095,858.60 mscf (10 percent) in 2016.

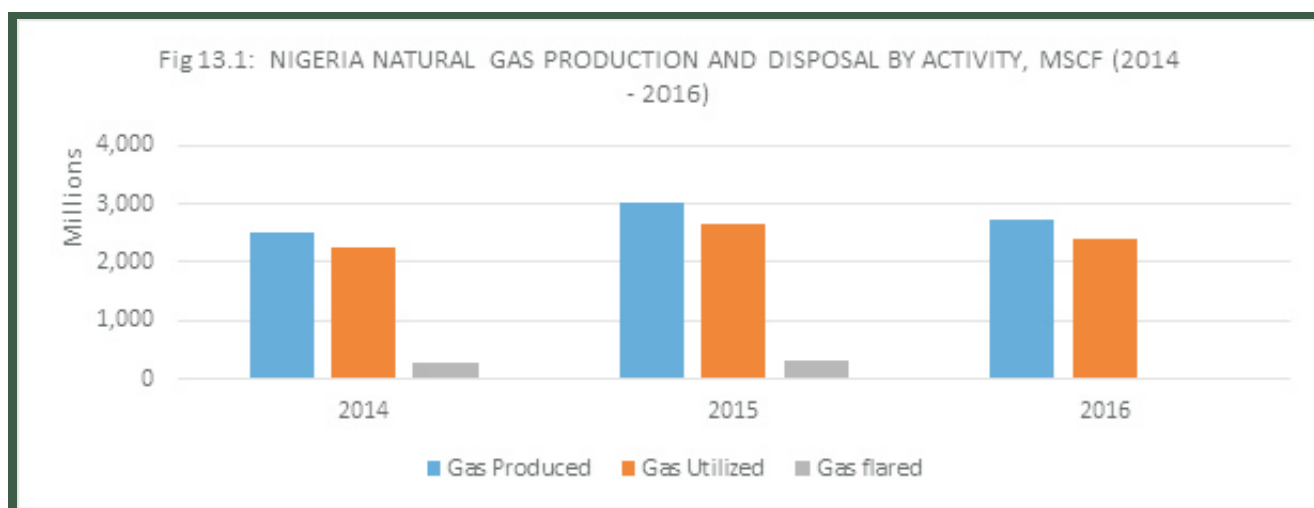

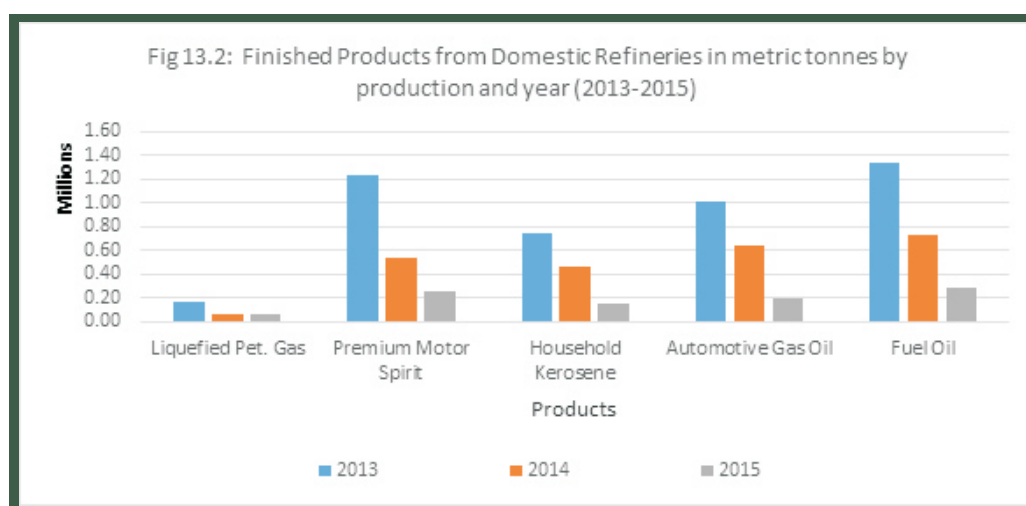

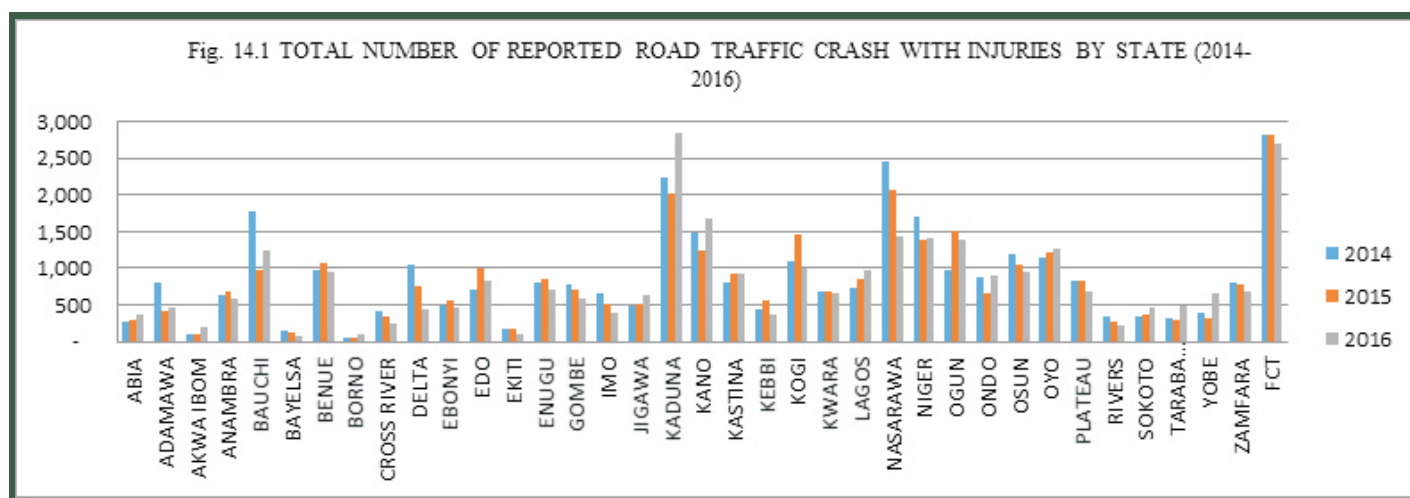


# CHAPTER FOURTEEN

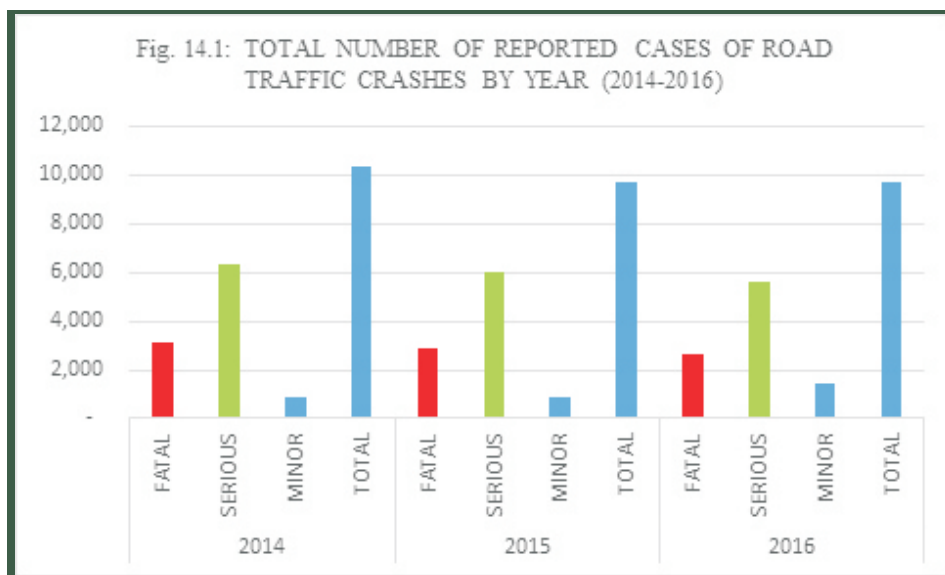

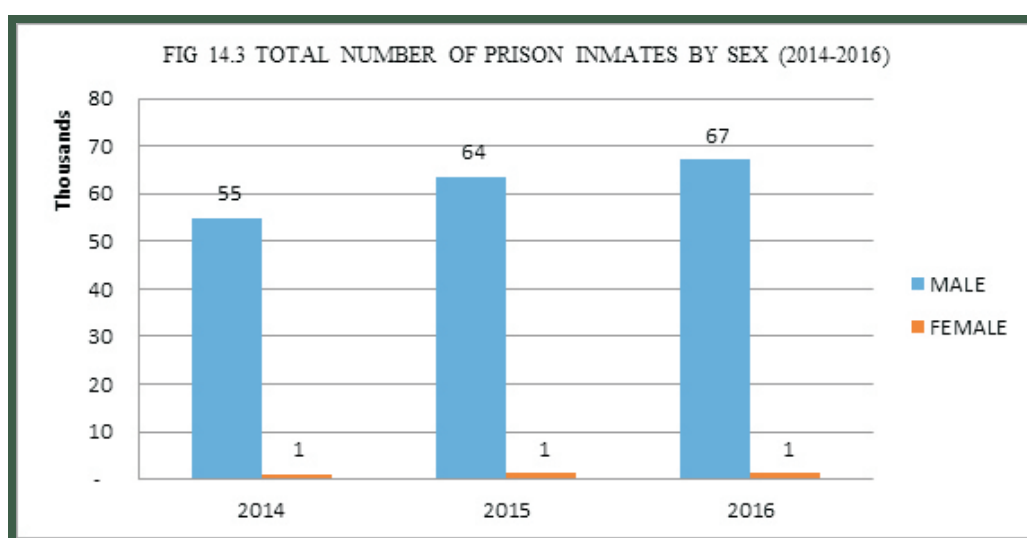

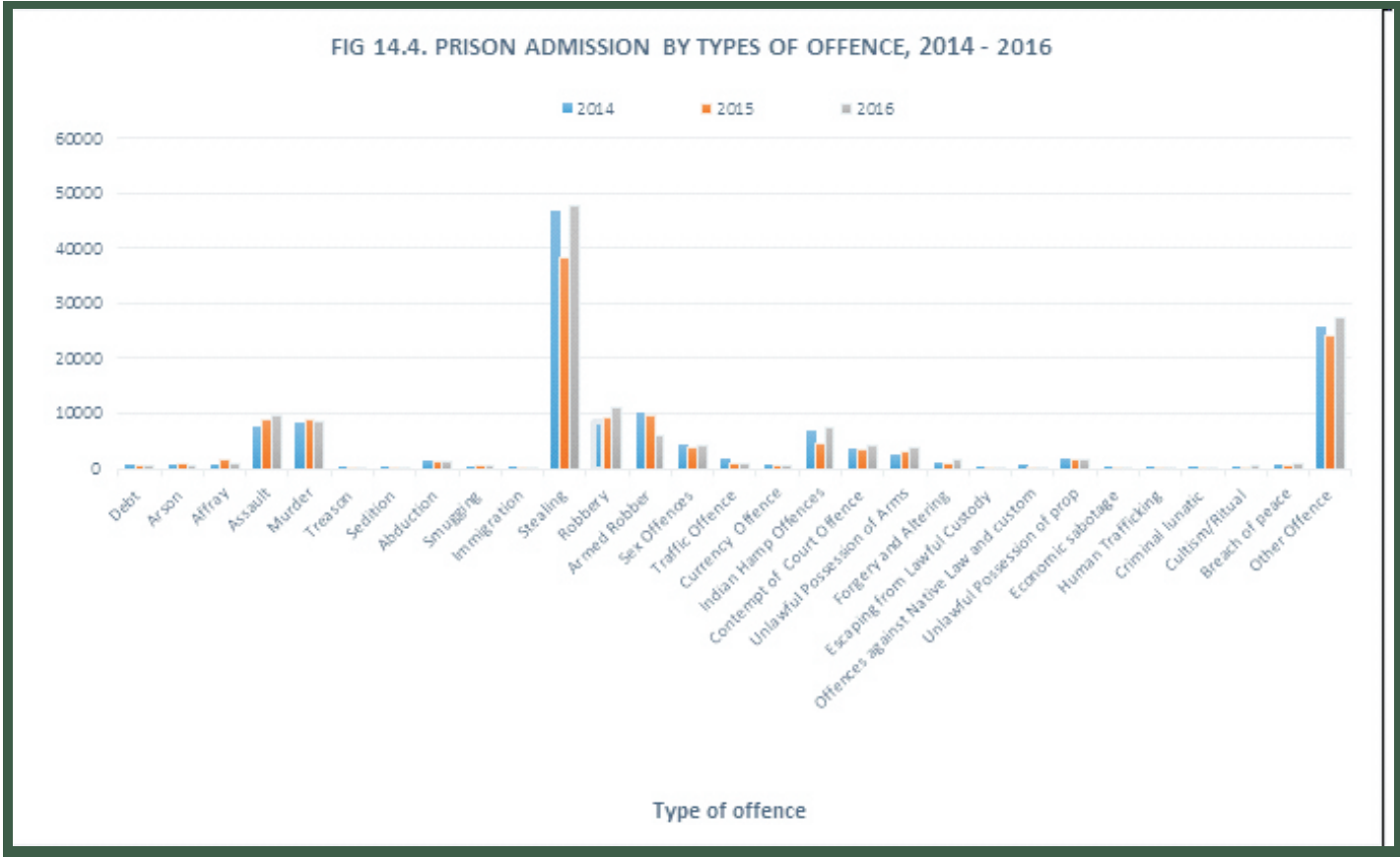

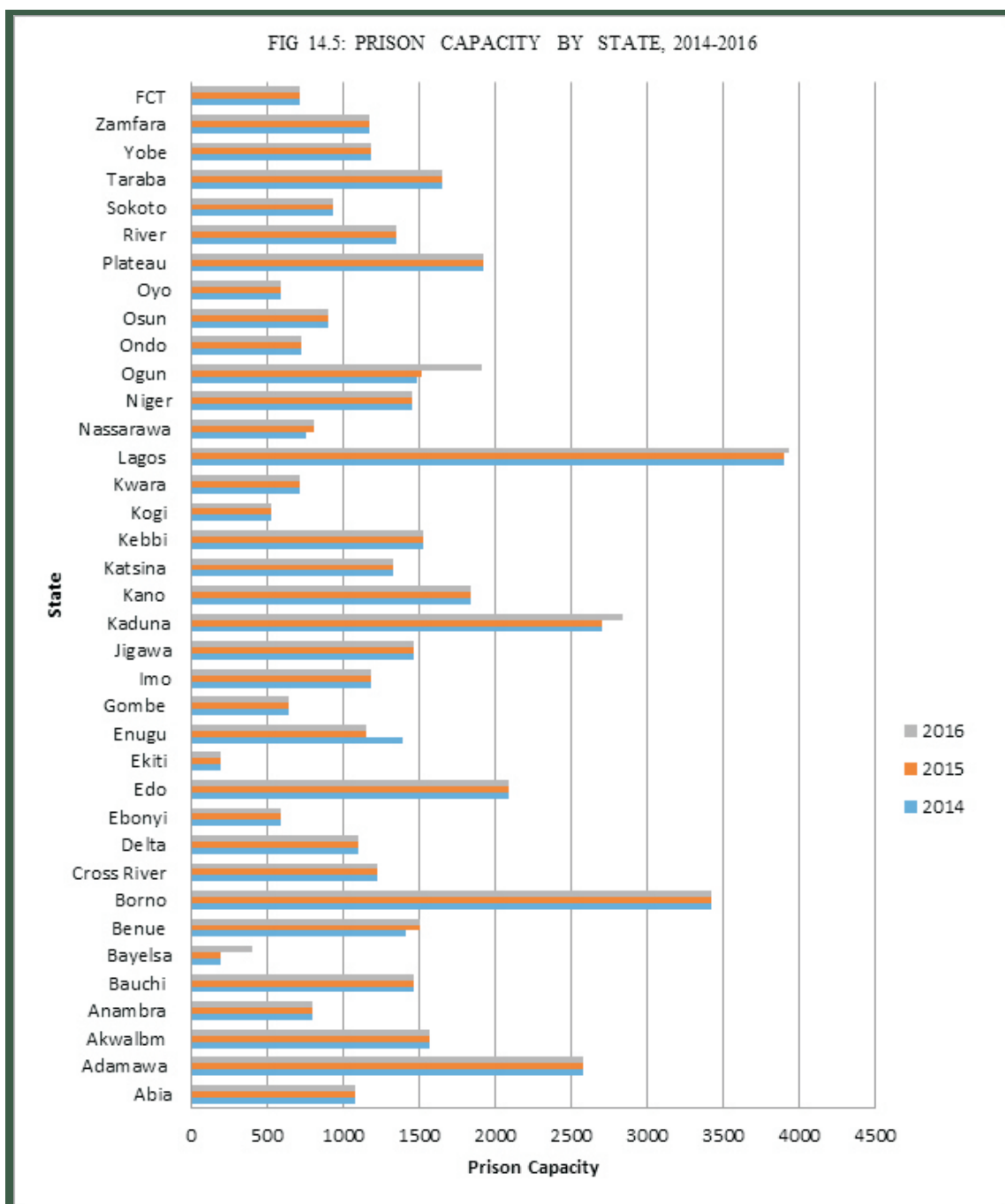

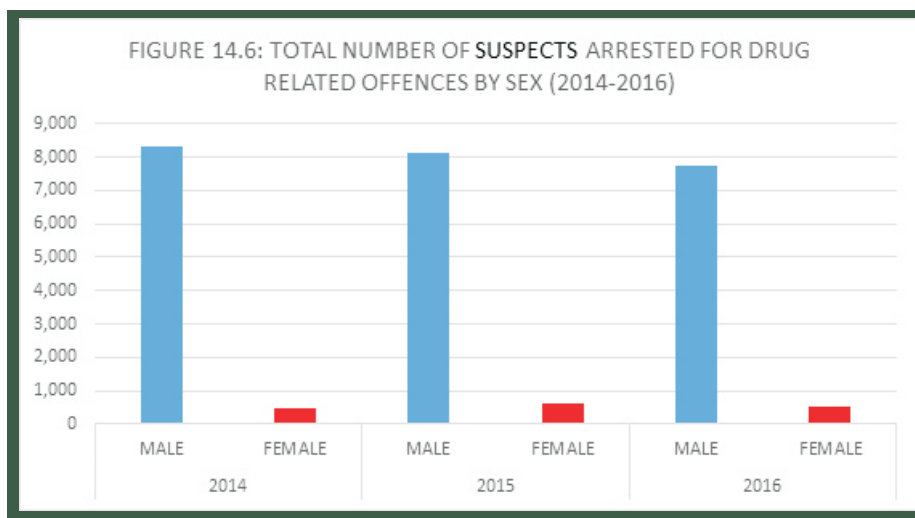


FIGURE 14.7 SHOWS THE TOTAL NUMBER OF DRUG CASES BY GEO-POLITICAL ZONE (2014-2016).

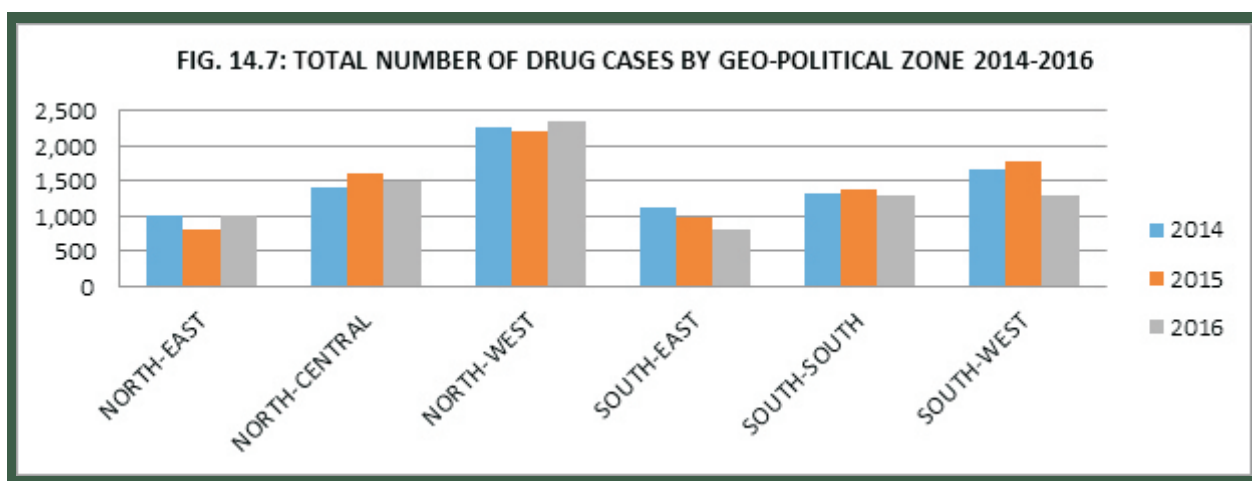


FIGURE 14.7 SHOWS THE TOTAL NUMBER OF DRUG CASES BY GEO-POLITICAL ZONE (2014-2016).

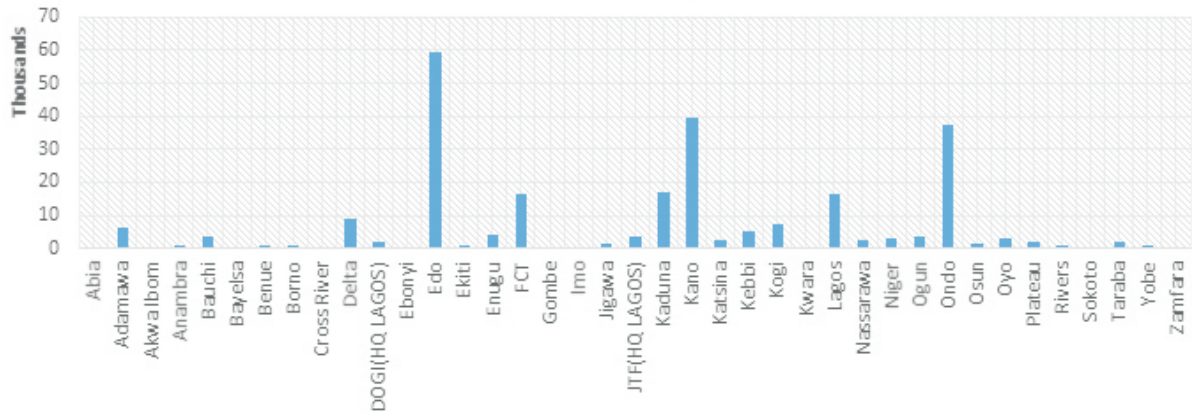


FIG 14.9: QUANTITY OF NARCOTIC DRUGS SEIZED(KG) BY STATE, SPECIAL AREA COMMAND 2016

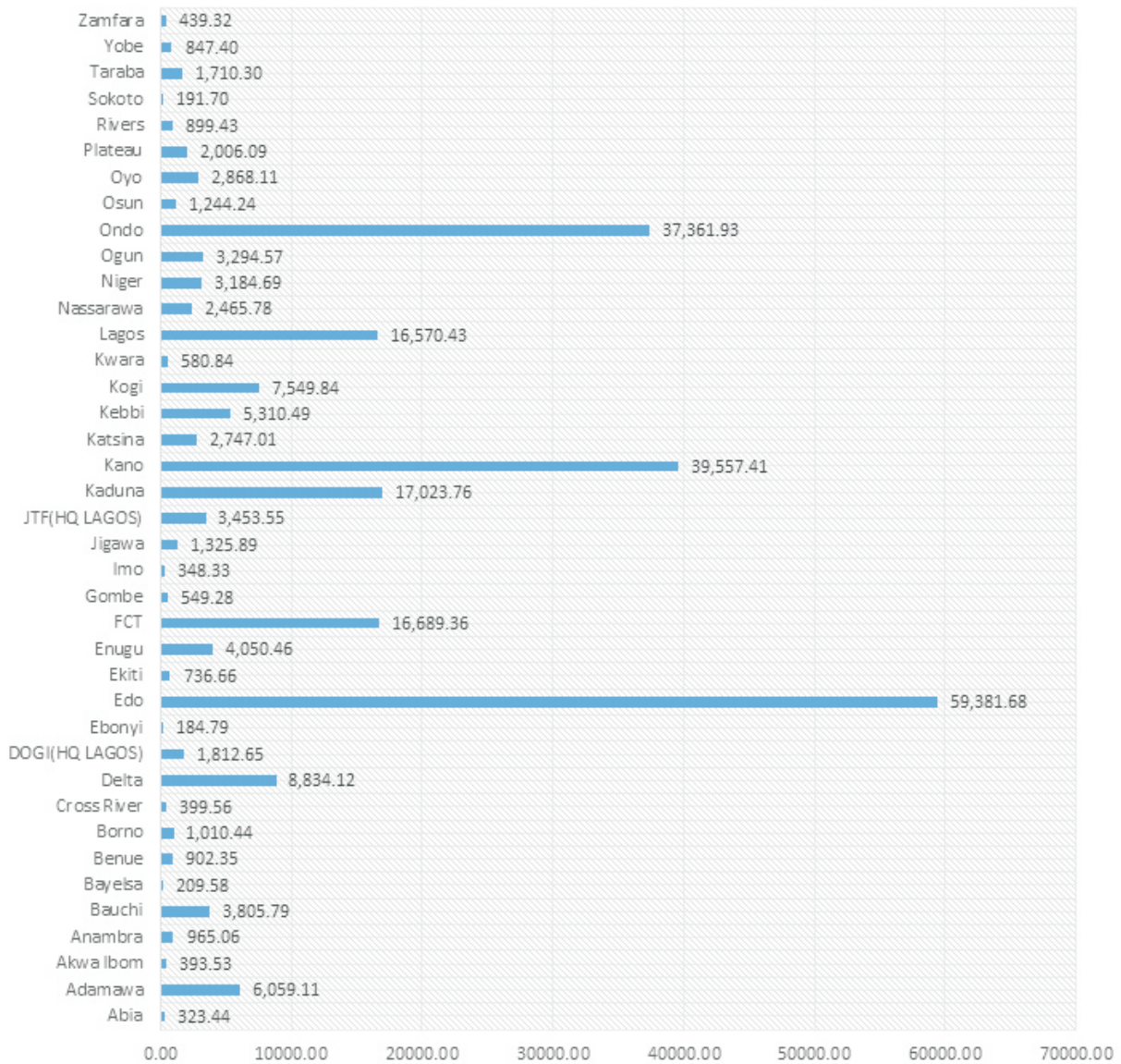

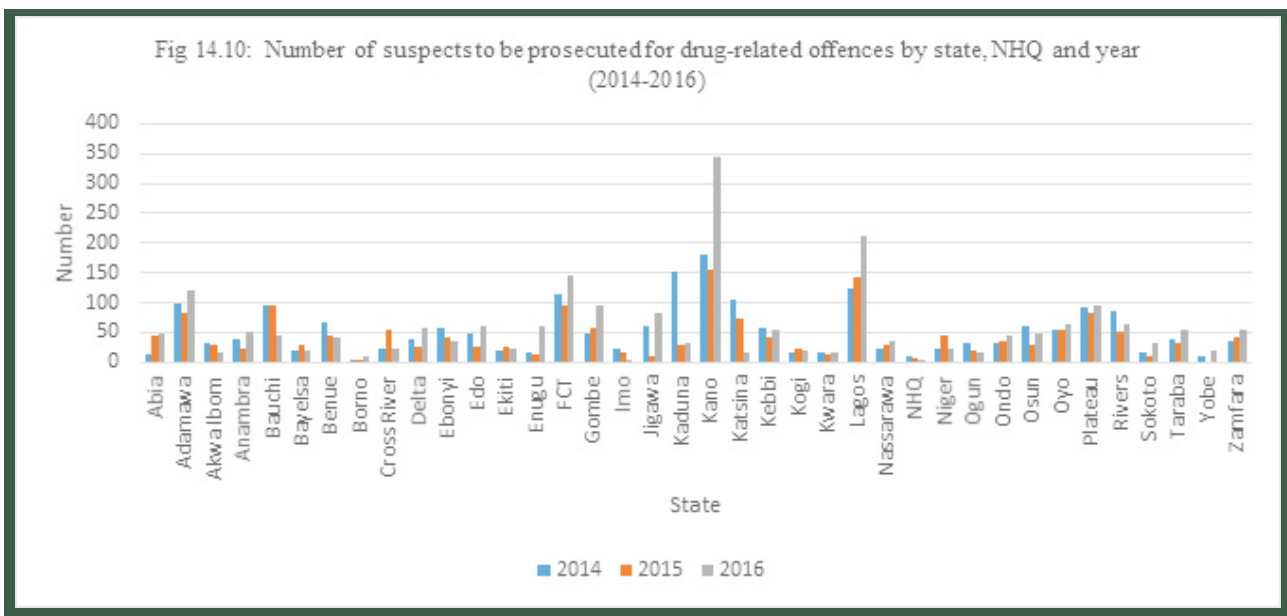

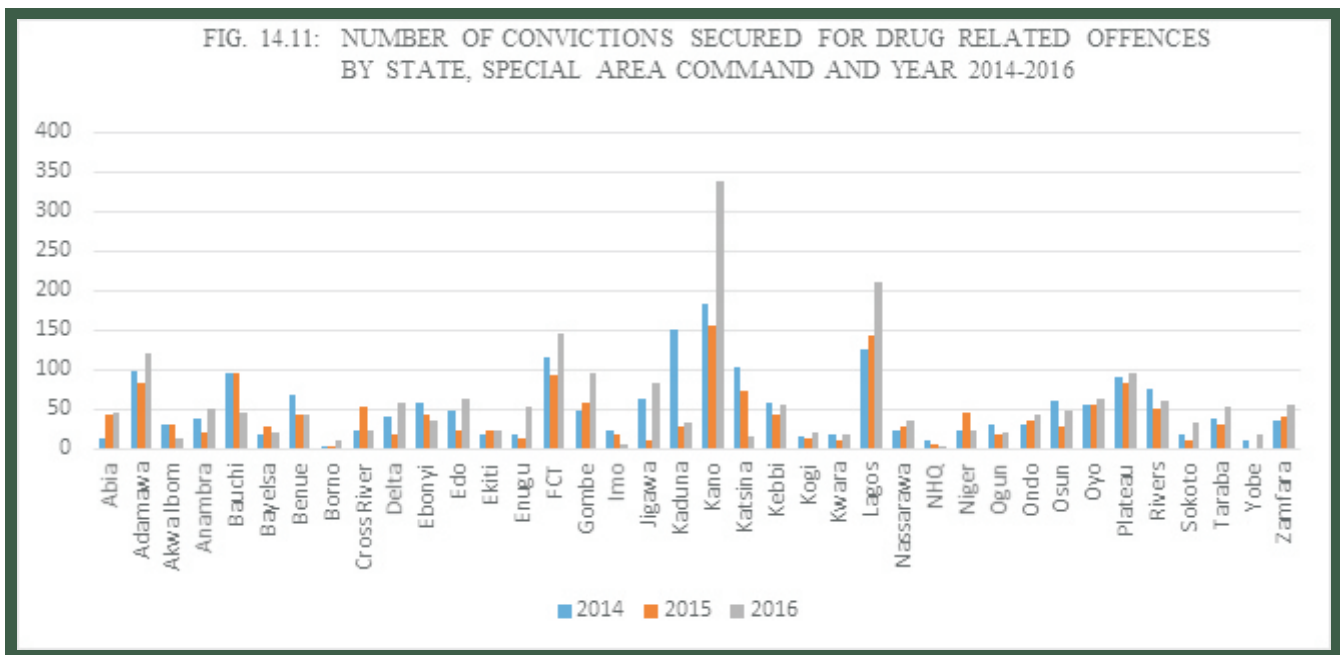

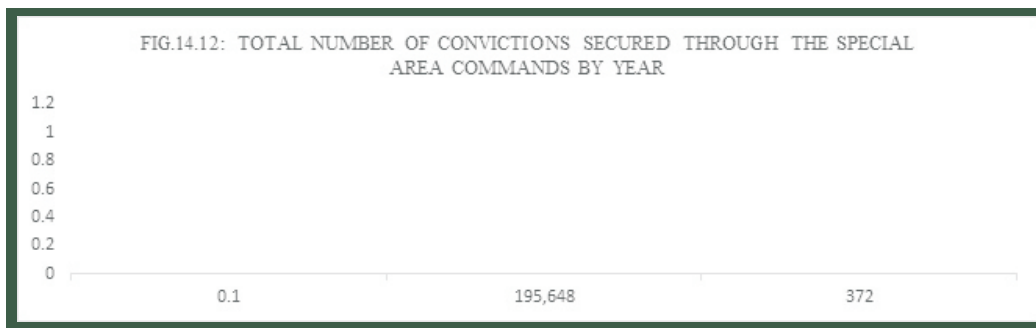

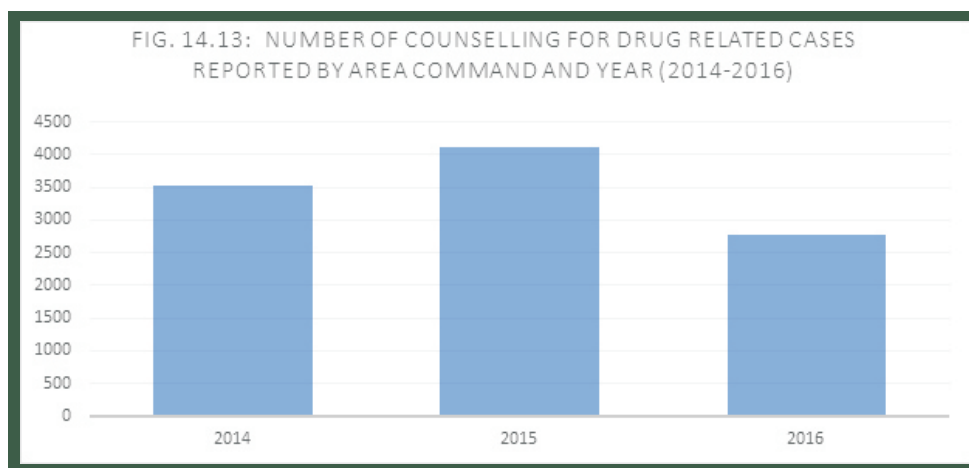

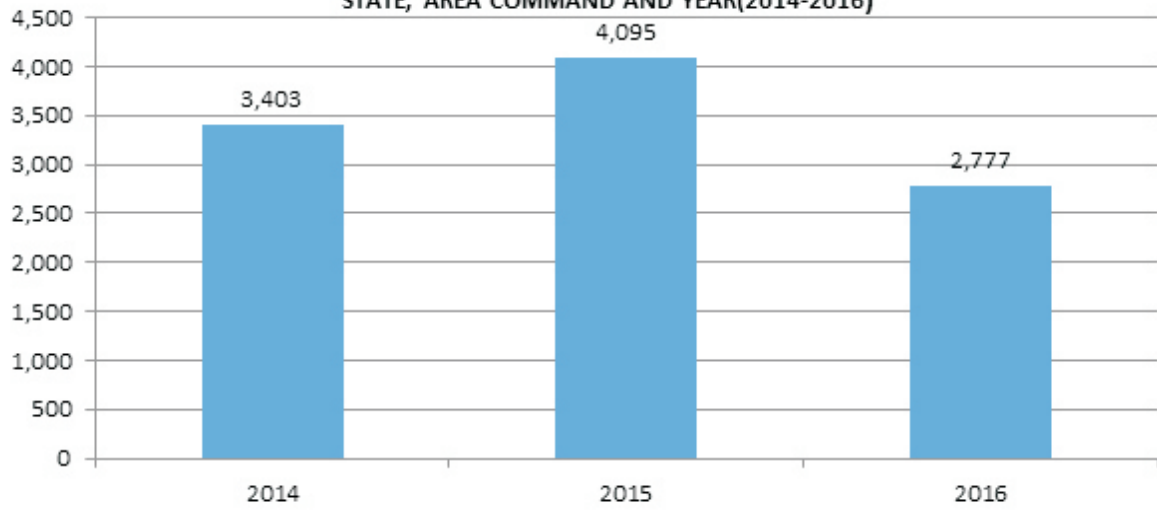

Transportation is the act of movement of humans, animals and goods from one location to another. Modes of transport in Nigeria include air, land (rail and road) and water. Transportation is important because it enables trade between people, which is essential for the development of civilizations and the economy. This chapter provides data on vehicle number plates produced, drivers' licenses issued, road crashes – number of crashes, casualties involved, etc. from Federal Road Safety Commission.

Table 15.1 shows that in 2015, a total of 303,120 motor vehicle number plates were produced, compared to 217,282 in 2016. A total of 269,769 motorcycle number plates were produced in 2015 and 199,756 in 2016.

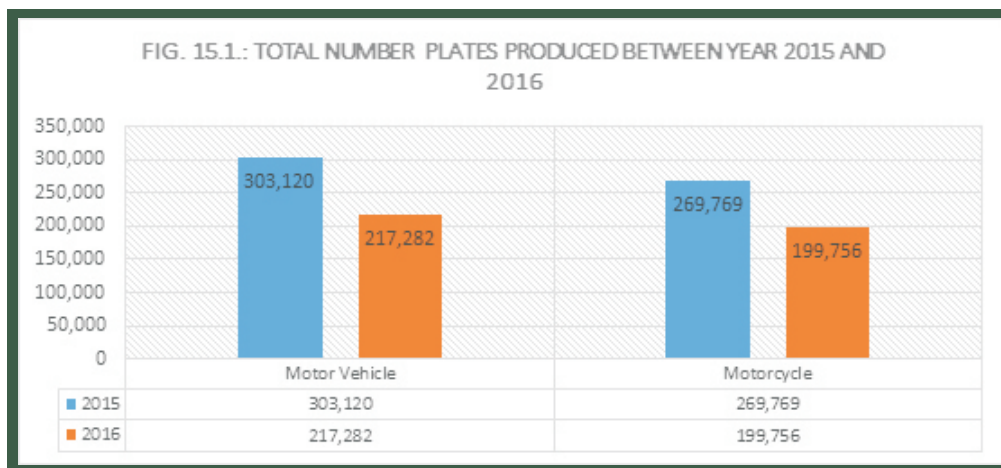


Table 15.2 shows the number of drivers' licence processed in 2014 to 2016. At state level, Lagos state recorded the highest with 293,319 and 220,345 in 2015 and 2016 respectively. This was followed by FCT with 106,946 in 2015 and 68,419 in 2016, while Yobe state (2,375 and 1,524) and Zamfara state (3,433 and 2,323) recorded the least in both years respectively.

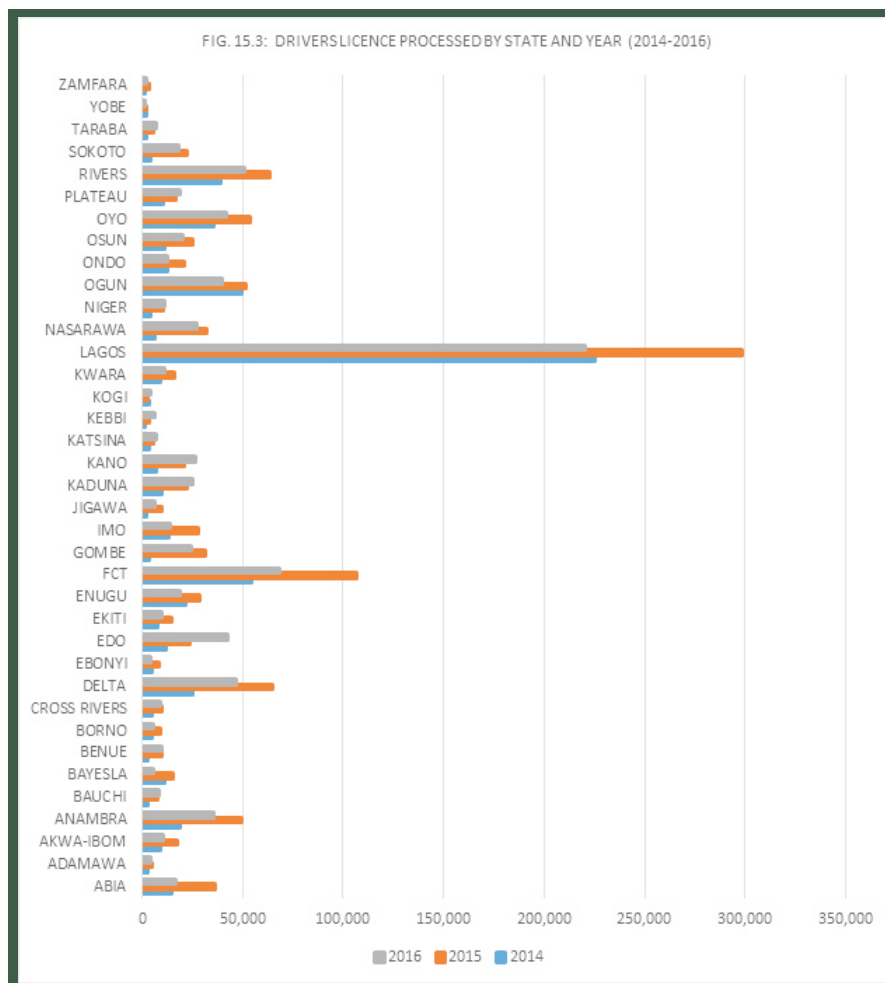
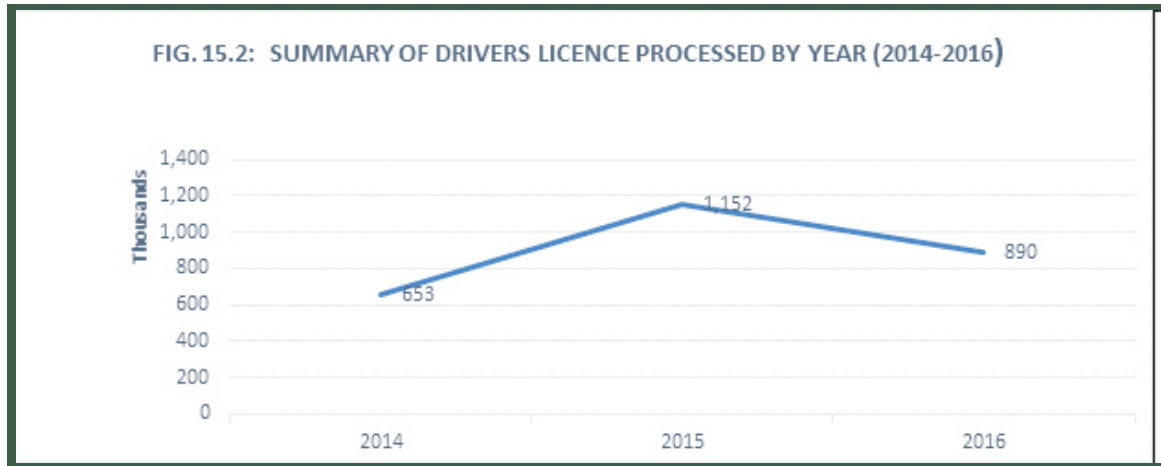


Table 15.3 presents the summary of reported cases of road traffic crash and casualties involved. Total reported cases of traffic crash in 2014 was 10,380, but decreased to 9,734 and 9,694 in 2015 and 2016 respectively. Serious cases recorded the highest over the three year of review with 6,356 (2014), 6,039 (2015) and 5,633 (2016). Of the reported cases in 2016, 35,158 casualties were involved, with 3,970 Male, 1,083 female killed and 22,705 Male, 7,400 Female injured.

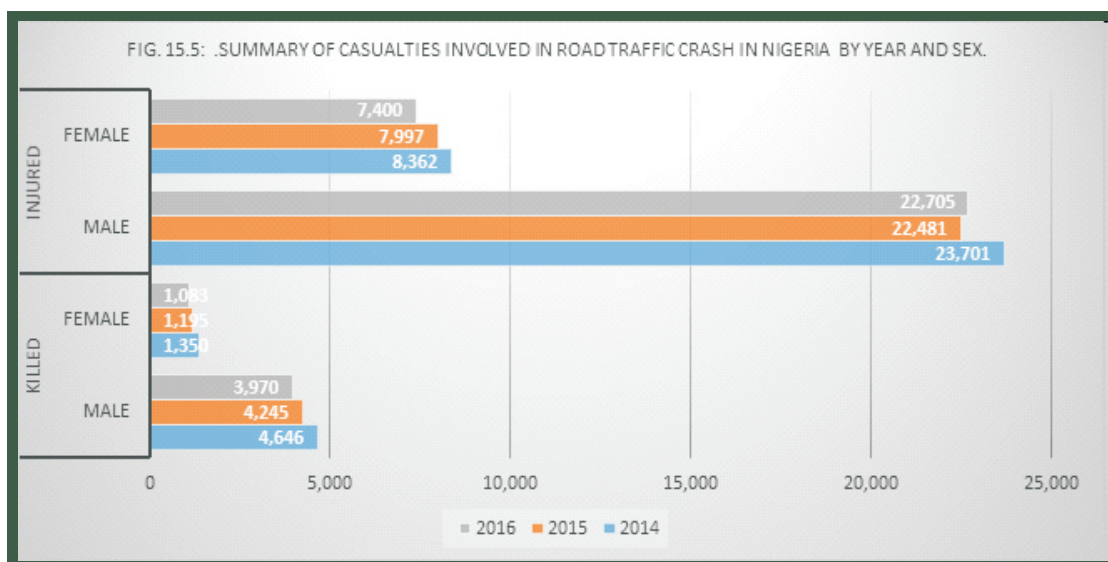
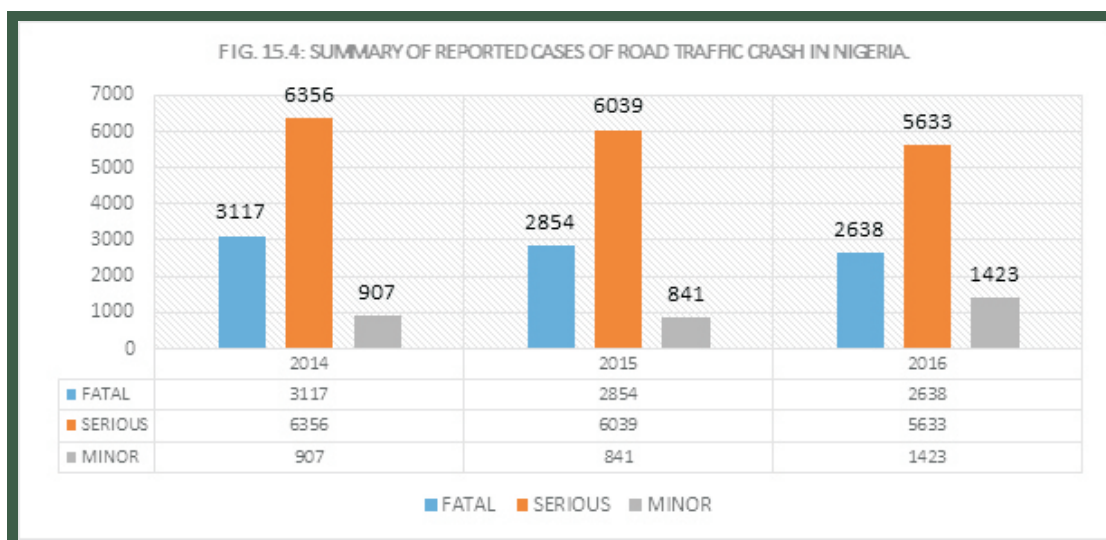
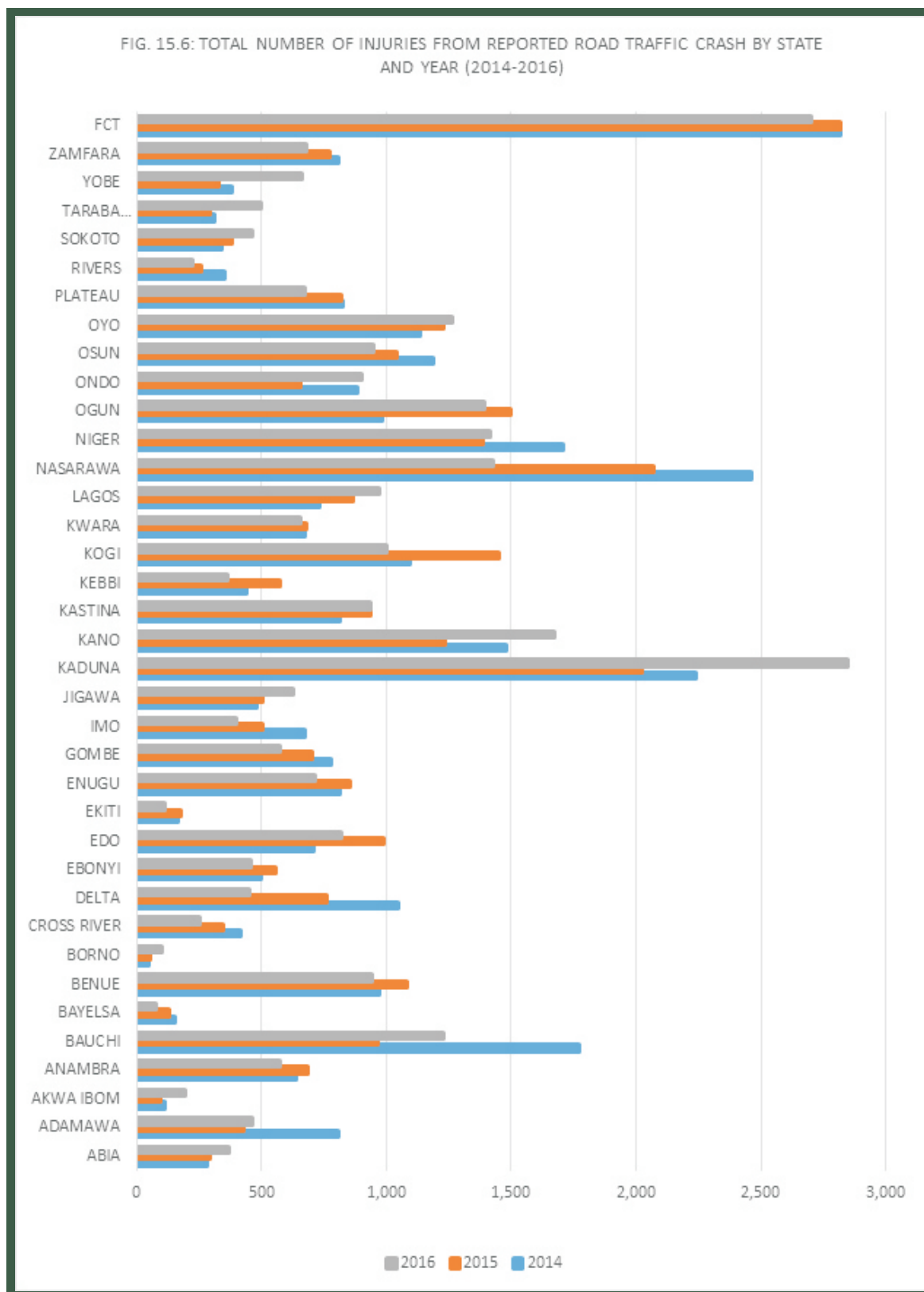


Fig.15.6 gives the total number of injuries from reported road traffic crash by state and year. Kaduna state recorded the highest number of injuries with 2,849 in 2016 and was closely followed by FCT with 2,700, while the least was recorded in Bayelsa state with 80.



# CHAPTER SIXTEEN

## YOUTH AND SPORTS

In Nigeria, Youth includes citizens of the country aged 18–35 years. Nigeria is the most populous country in Africa with one of the largest populations of youth in the world and this comes with its peculiar social and economic implications. The government characterizes youth as ambitious, enthusiastic, energetic and promising. They are considered vulnerable in society because of the rapid pace of change they experience at this time in their lives. Sports includes all forms of physical activity or which, through casual or organised participation, aim to use, maintain or improve physical ability and skills while providing enjoyment to participants, and in some cases, entertainment for spectators. Sports is an integral activity that unites Nigerians together despite their diversity in culture, tradition and politics.

Table 16.1 shows the distribution of deployed corps members (NYSC) by sex and year (2015 -2016). Nationally, 133,737 male and 112,780 female corps members were deployed in 2015 amounting to 246,517 corps members. This increased to 301,340 in 2016 made up of 158,198 males and 143,142 females.

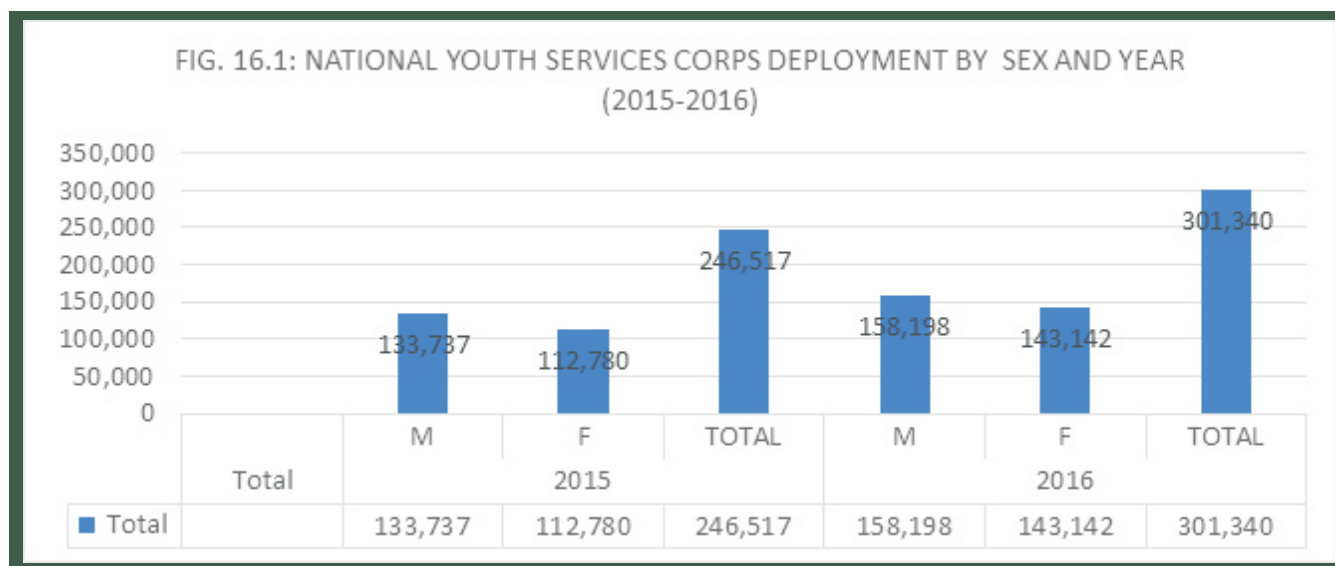
